### **Going the Second Mile**

A farmer left his son to plow a large field, instructing him to plow out the peach trees and try to finish the job by the end of the day. When the farmer returned that evening, he discovered that his son had plowed all the way out to the road, far beyond the peach trees. It was almost twice the amount of work he had expected his son to do. When he asked his son about it, the boy replied, “Dad, I plowed out to the peach tree because you told me to. But, I plowed on out to the road because I wanted to.” The *wanted to* in this boy’s response is the language of genuine love. Only the love of Christ within us can compel us to go beyond the requirements and give more than expected. Christians should pray daily for the love of Christ to direct us in all our dealings with others. “And whoever compels you to go one mile,” Jesus taught, “*go with him, two!*” (Mt 5:41)
