Hallowe'en and the Communion of Saints

Hallowe'en has grown into a major secular holiday in North American culture. But for those who do not value devotions to the SAINTS, the Eve has become "hallow". The purpose behind it has been lost....It's like celebrating New year's Eve without New year's Day. Take away the saints and our beliefs about the dignity and destiny of human beings and the only thing left is "bats, goblins and witches" and some terrible movies.

Among many Christians, there has been concern that things have gotten out of hand. After all, doesn't Hallowe'en glorify evil? Is it right to send our children out into the street as devils and vampires, or is it better to emphasize the saints, whose nearly forgotten feast day is the reason for Hallowe'en? Hallow is the same word for holy that we find in the "Our Father" and the e'en is a contraction of evening." the word Hallowe'en itself is a shortened form of "All Hallows Eve", the day before All Saints Day.

The key to our understanding of what "Hallowe'en is about, lies in our understanding of the Church's teaching of THE COMMUNION OF THE SAINTS, which we proclaim in the Creed every Sunday. The Communion of Saints teaches that there is a remarkable link between the faithful who have already reached heaven, those who are expiating their sins (making up for their sins) in purgatory and those of us who are still on our pilgrim journey on earth, struggling to get to heaven. We, on earth, have a responsibility to pray for those in purgatory to speed them on their way to the kingdom. We do this especially in the month of November by our prayers and the offering of the Eucharist on their behalf.

Here at Corpus Christi in keeping with the long-standing tradition of the Church dating back to the 9th century, we will celebrate **THE FEAST OF ALL SAINTS** on **Saturday, Nov 1st with Mass at 8:30am**. We honour all those men and women, canonized and those not canonized, who are models of virtue for us and guides for Christian living. **On Sunday, Nov 2nd at our regularly scheduled Masses at 8, 10, 12 we will celebrate THE COMMENMORATION OF THE FAITHFUL DEPARTED**, a tradition of the 11th century.

We will have a **Remembrance Table** in the Sanctuary at Corpus Christi. We ask you to inscribe the name of the dead who you wish to be remembered at all the Masses we will celebrate during the month of November. Each week there will be a special Mass for our deceased family members, friends and benefactors.

I would encourage you all to make an effort in this month to celebrate with us during daily Mass and pray for those who gave us life and helped to mold and shape us. I would invite you to pass on this teaching to your children and grandchildren; it might benefit us when it is **OUR** turn and **WE** might be in need.
