


# Holy Family

## RENEW MY CHURCH

### What to Expect in the Coming Months

All parishes have been assigned a grouping in which they will work with surrounding parishes to determine opportunities of future collaboration and unity, whether through structures or ministries or both. As I've shared, our parish will be working with Notre Dame, the Shrine of Our Lady of Pompeii, and the UIC Newman Center as one group to discern and decide how we will work together to make disciples, build community, and inspire witness.

Together, we will work through multiple stages on a shared journey of renewal:

1. Discernment & Decisions. A selected team known as the Grouping Feedback and Discernment Team will reflect upon potential scenarios of how our local parishes and schools may be organized differently in the future and develop potential ideas to achieve the mission imperatives. This stage concludes when Cardinal Cupich makes his final decisions regarding any structural changes affecting the grouping.

2. Operations Transition. Once decisions are made that result in structural/organizational changes to the grouping, a dedicated support team from the archdiocese works on-site to help pastors manage the transition and ensure new parishes have strong, sustainable operational foundations, upon which the great work of ministry can be built to achieve our mission Imperatives. 3. Building the New Reality. At this point in the process, with the structural, operational, financial, and personnel foundations in place, the grouping will focus its efforts on vibrantly living out the three imperatives. At the core will be a culture of evangelization that supports the work of making disciples, building community, and inspiring witness.
