

RENEW MY CHURCH FEEDBACK AND DISCERNMENT TEAM.

Renew My Church is our faithful response to Christ's call to renew His Church in Chicago; it is a journey that is both spiritual (to re-encounter Jesus Christ as disciples and parish communities) and structural (to ensure that we have adequate resources for vitality). There are several factors and changes that will lead to successful renewal. Creating vibrant parishes that exhibit the marks of parish vitality requires that we direct current and future resources to the critical ministries that will get us there. To do that, we need to evaluate the business structures (how we operate), buildings, facilities, and the financial requirements of existing parishes to assess where we can more prudently apply our resources to support and strengthen key ministry leadership roles, programs and activities. Ultimately, we must be good stewards of the gifts we have today to ensure they're able to support the faith lives of Catholics today and in the future.

Who and what is the Grouping Feedback & Discernment Team?

The Grouping Feedback & Discernment Team is a gathering of leaders from each parish/school in a grouping. These leaders are invited by their pastor to bring forth an open mind and heart as to what the Holy Spirit is asking of the community, and the ability to participate in the entire Renew My Church journey. The team meets for 3-4 months to discuss and prayerfully discern the ministerial and operational strengths and challenges of the parishes and schools within their particular grouping. Eventually the team will provide feedback and information about its grouping for Archdiocesan leadership to review and present recommendations to Cardinal Cupich so he can make final decisions regarding potential changes to school and parish structures.

Grouping Sessions and Parish Sessions

In September, our Grouping Feedback & Discernment Team will begin its series of conversations through early December. Along the way, there will also be parish sessions for all parishioners to learn more about the Renew My Church journey, stages, and implications for our parish. Dates and times of those parish sessions will be shared as soon as we have them scheduled. In the meantime, please pray for everyone as we form our Grouping Feedback & Discernment Team. May we all be open to where the Holy Spirit leads us in faith, hope and charity.



THE CATHOLIC CHUCH IN CHINA

At both Masses on August 12, a board member of the U.S. - China Catholic Association will give the annual **Mission Appeal.** A long missionary relationship has existed between American and Chinese Catholics. That bond was severely strained after the successful Communist Revolution in 1949. Fearing the continuation of Western colonialism, China's Central Government tried to snuff out foreign influences. All foreign missionaries were expelled, native Catholic and other Christian clergy, religious and lay people were persecuted/ jailed/ silenced, and church buildings were turned into warehouses. The reality was no public Masses, no First Communions, no priests, no Sisters - for several decades. To the one million Chinese Catholics in 1949 and to the universal Church, it looked like the Church in China was dying. However, faith-filled grandparents and parents were secretly passing on their faith within their families.

But with a change in national leadership in the 1980's (the Holy Spirit working?), a Resurrection was occurring. China slowly began initiating and responding again to cultural and religious influences from the outside world, and allowing very limited religious activities.

Into this atmosphere, in 1989, the U.S. Catholic China Bureau began as a joint initiative of the Maryknoll and Jesuit Societies and other religious communities, and was endorsed by the U.S. Bishops Conference.

From then on, the Bureau has continued to work to raise awareness in the U.S. Church of the difficult challenges before the Chinese Catholic Church, and to partner with our sisterchurch in meeting them. There has been tremendous growth, with more than 12,000,000 Catholics in China today. This includes 138 dioceses, 6,000+ churches, 107 bishops, 3,200+ priests, 5,000+ Sisters, 34 social service centers, 136 clinics, 8 hospitals, 175 schools.

But 10,000,000 among a population of 1,400,000,000, 70% of whom are agnostic or atheistic??! Your prayer and financial support are deeply needed to spread the Gospel in China today.
