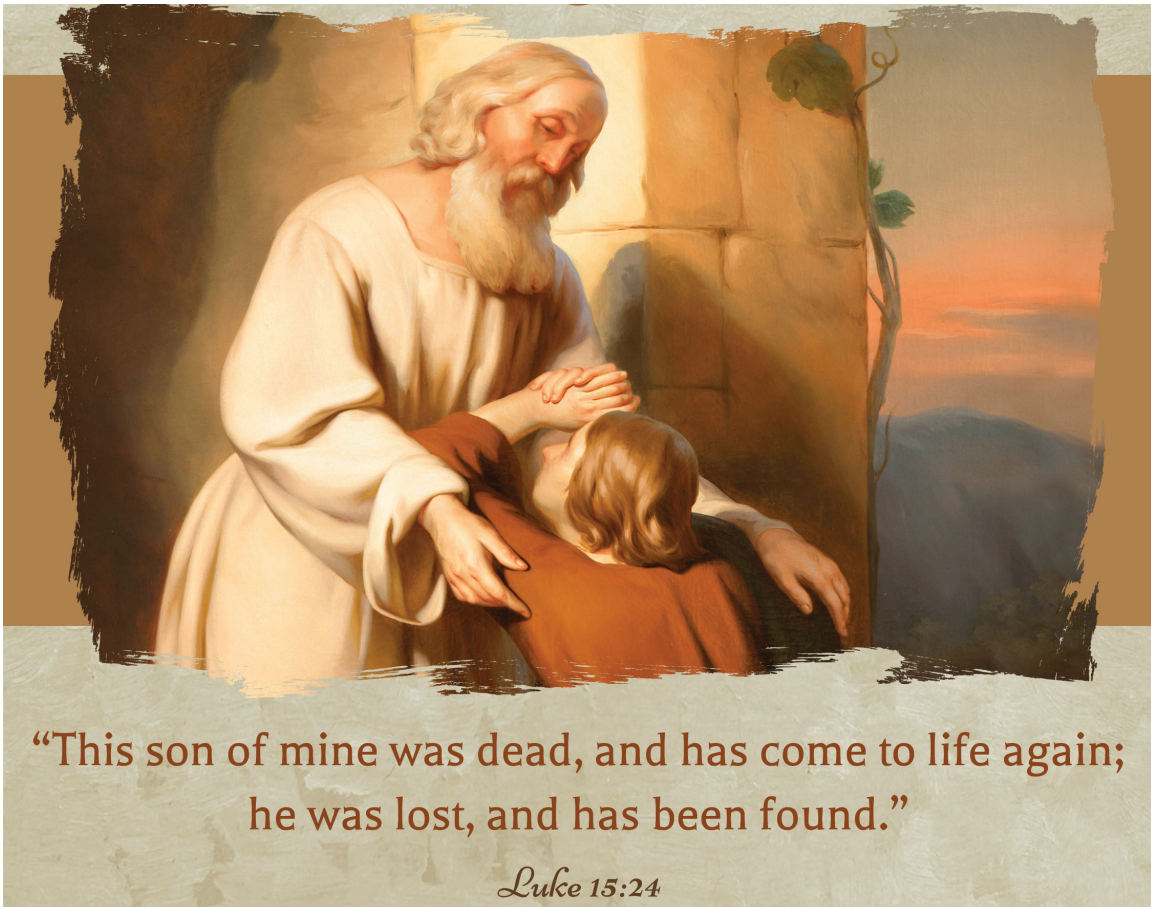

LENTEN REGULATION:

ABSTINENCE: Everyone fourteen years of age and older is bound to abstain from meat on *FRIDAYS of Lent* and *GOOD FRIDAY*.

When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige. In doubt concerning fast, a priest assigned to pastoral ministry or confessor should be consulted. In the spirit of penance, the faithful should not lightly excuse themselves from this obligation.

Lenten practices of giving up pleasures are good reminders that the purpose of life is not pleasure. The purpose of life is to attain to perfect life, all truth and undying ecstatic love – which is the definition of God. In pursuing that goal we find happiness. Pleasure is not the purpose of anything; pleasure is a by-product resulting from doing something that is good. One of the best ways to get happiness and pleasure out of life is to ask ourselves, 'How can I please God?' and, 'Why am I not better?' It is the pleasure-seeker who is bored, for all pleasures diminish with repetition.

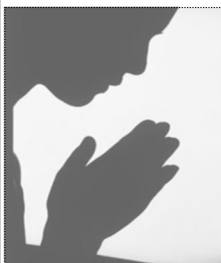

Reflection from Catholic Charities on Pope Francis' Recent Statement Against Anti-Semitism

Catholic Charities Advocates for People of All Faith and Backgrounds

Catholic Charities actively stands with our Jewish friends against intolerance, hate, and injustice as we advocate for social equity and serve those who are marginalized in our local communities, including families and individuals who are poor and vulnerable. We affirm Pope Francis' recent statement against anti-Semitism, intolerance, and "excessive and depraved hate."

In his remarks during a March 8th meeting with leaders from the American Jewish Committee, Pope Francis stressed the value of interreligious dialogue to promote peace, mutual respect, and the protection of life – values Catholic Charities puts into practice every day as we serve people of all faiths and backgrounds in San Francisco, San Mateo and Marin Counties. Recent expressions of these values:

~ Jewish Rabbis recently joined Catholic Priests and Muslim Imams to offer interfaith blessings at events highlighting Catholic Charities services to help people in desperate circumstances live with dignity and hope.

~ Catholic Charities' CEO and staff stood with congregants at Bay Area synagogues this past October in the wake of the Pittsburgh shootings.

~ Together with our partners at the Jewish Community Relations Council (JCRC), Catholic Charities spearheaded a three-part series in the Bay Area last year about how to vote and voting options for people with disabilities.
