BISHOPS ON RETREAT

From January 2 to January 8 all the Bishops in our country were asked by Pope Francis to spend eight days in prayer. At Mundeleine Seminary of the Archdiocese of Chicago the bishops prepared themselves for their February 6th meeting. At that time decisions will be made resolving the abuse crisis in the Church.

POPE FRANCIS

Pope Francis delivered a blunt message Thursday to his American bishops — stop “playing the victim or the scold” and do something about the “culture of abuse” that has resulted in a crisis of credibility for the U.S. Roman Catholic Church.



“These have been times of turbulence in the lives of all those victims who suffered in their flesh the abuse of power. Francis told the bishops there needs to be a change in “our way of praying, our handling of power and money, our exercise of authority and our way of relating to one another and to the world around us.” “Our Catholicity is at stake,” he wrote.
