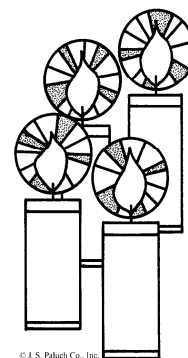

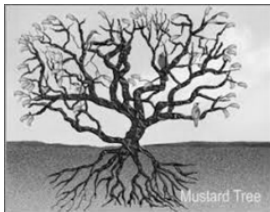

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

On the weekend of June 24, our diocese will take up the Peter's Pence Collection. Our participation supports the charitable work of Pope Francis as he reaches out to those who are marginalized and suffering around the globe.
