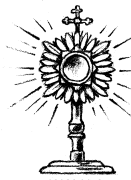

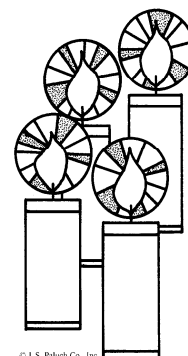

THE IMPORTANCE OF VOTING IN THE PRIMARY ELECTION ON SEPTEMBER 4TH

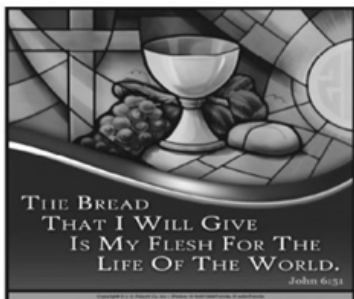
DIVINE MERCY MOMENT
