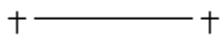

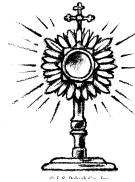
**FROM THE BLESSED SACRAMENT CHAPEL**

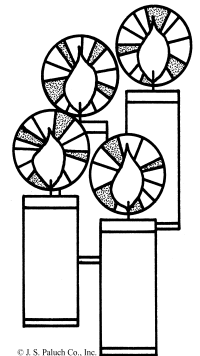

The 40 DFL National team is reporting 120 babies' lives saved already during this campaign and today (Thursday, March 21) we were able to add **1 from Worcester** to that total!

The 40 DFL participant who was instrumental in reaching out to a couple heading into Planned Parenthood was only stopping by the vigil for 15 minutes to pray with a friend between business appointments in the area. She encouraged the couple not to go into Planned Parenthood and to seek help at Problem Pregnancy instead, which they did. After receiving counseling and help addressing some issues, the couple realized they could have their baby and left smiling and saying, **“God bless you people.”**

I hope this will inspire more of you to join us out on the sidewalk ! **Where else can you spend 15 minutes in prayer and save a life?** So come when you can, and know that if you spend your time at vigil in sincere prayer, God will use your time in ways you cannot imagine.

When we respond to those in need, we “help Jesus in disguise” as we are reminded by the national **Catholic Relief Services Collection on the weekend of April 7**.
