From Father's Desk

My Dear Parish,

We have a bishop!

Pope Francis announced this past Thursday that Archbishop Wilton Gregory will be our new Archbishop here in the Archdiocese of Washington. We've been praying for this for several months and the day has finally arrived. Next month, on May 21 at 2:00 PM in St. Matthew's Cathedral in Washington DC, Archbishop Gregory will be formally installed and begin his new role as our Archbishop.

Archbishop Gregory comes to us from the Archdiocese of Atlanta, where he has been serving as the Archbishop since 2005. He is originally from Chicago. He was ordained a priest for the Archdiocese of Chicago in 1973 and in 1983 was ordained an auxiliary bishop there.

Archbishop Gregory will be the first black Archbishop of a major metropolitan Archdiocese in our country. We are a parish made up in part since its beginning of black Catholics. This historic first should be for us a cause of a special joy. It's a particular sign of the spiritual fruitfulness of the apostolic faith in our country that our clergy and hierarchy should be thoroughly representative of our local countrymen.

Please pray very much for our new Archbishop. He has a huge responsibility of protecting and guiding us in the practice of the faith by his preaching and by his example. He deserves our prayers and we have an obligation to love and to support him by our faithful and constant prayers to God and to Our Lady on his behalf.

May God strengthen Archbishop Gregory and protect him. May he stand firm in the faith and care for us with God's strength.


