Wednesday, November 1<sup>st</sup>, is the Feast Day of All Saints (a Holy Day of Obligation), a celebration for all of us at 8:30am and 7pm Masses. November 2nd is a Feast Day for All Souls. The practical faith of Christians regarding saints is a living out of the Church's understanding of itself as a communion (common union) of saints. It describes the Church as a community or fellowship of all the faithful, living and dead, called together by God and transformed in Christ and the Spirit. This whole community is present and is most effectively expressed and celebrated whenever people gather for the Eucharist.

Thanksgiving Day, November 23rd (Mass at 9am) is a time to give thanks for the family of saints in our lives. Continuing these celebrations, December 3<sup>rd</sup> is the First Sunday of Advent, the beginning of the Church year, a time to be watchful, to repent, to do penance in anticipation of the celebration of the birth of Christ on Monday, December 25.

**November is the month to remember** "those who have gone before us marked with the sign of faith." We think about **our loved ones who have passed on** to the next life. These days, we may also remember those who have died in recent tragedies: both natural disasters and horrific acts of public violence.

When we call to mind fellow human beings who have died, we can consider them part of our "litany of saints" --- those who inspire us and guide us as we continue our journey here on earth.

The concept of the "community of saints" often seems strange and unnecessary to those whose faith lies outside the Catholic tradition. Why do we give so much attention and a place on our Liturgical Calendar to people who have died?

Well, it has a lot to do with **the power of collective prayer.** We have all experienced changes taking place for persons or situations when we pray for them. **Being able to place our collective, prayerful intention** on a person or situation is a **gift given to us by God** to allow us to support each other and become **instruments of God's grace.** 

Similarly, when we call upon the saints for their intercession (after all, they are still alive, living in God's presence, and have the power of intention!), we are calling forth the collective focus of the "community of saints" into our midst.





SAVE THE DATE: Thanksgiving Day, 9:00AM Mass...no better way to acknowledge all of God's blessings! The second Beyond Sunday rebate of \$15,114.83 to Mary, Mother was received on September 15, 2017. These funds were placed in the special account dedicated to the amounts returned from Beyond Sunday to be used per the plan to invest in Mary Mother as previously determined by our Parish Council. Total received to date is \$60,555.88.
