Some Summer Projects

Did you know that the church is 46 years old, and that the classrooms, offices and residence are at least 33 years old? Just as all of you homeowners do, the Administration-Finance Commission and the Parish Staff are always reviewing the needs of our campus and the five buildings (Church, Classrooms, Offices and Residence, the Parish Activity Center and the Annex) we maintain. Here are some of the projects scheduled for this summer:

- Upgrade the Parish Hall Audio and Video systems
- Install a swipe card access for the PAC
- Convert our 5 electric furnaces to natural gas
- Replace the room dividers
- Install new flooring and new carpeting in the lower hallway and classrooms.

The time frame for when these projects will begin is still being finalized. If your group meets regularly during the summer, you may be asked to meet in a different location here on the campus for a meeting or two. These projects are being funded by our Parish Major Project Fund and our returns from the Beyond Sunday Campaign.

Back in March of 2018, Pope Francis decreed that the Monday after Pentecost should be the **Memorial of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of the Church**. For years to come, **we will be celebrating this day as our Parish Feast Day**.

Here are a few words from the Pope's decree about this new memorial: "The **joyous veneration given to the Mother of God** by the contemporary Church, in light of reflection on the mystery of Christ and on his nature, cannot ignore **the figure of a woman, the Virgin Mary, who is both the Mother of Christ and Mother of the Church**. Indeed, the Mother standing beneath the cross, accepted her Son's testament of love and **welcomed all people in the person of the beloved disciple as sons and daughters to be reborn unto life eternal**. She thus became the tender **Mother of the Church**."

Having attentively considered how greatly the promotion of this devotion might encourage the growth of the maternal sense of the Church in the faithful, as well as a growth of genuine Marian piety, **Pope Francis has decreed that the Memorial of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of the Church, should be inscribed in the Roman Calendar on the Monday after Pentecost and be now celebrated every year.**"

TITHING

March 2018 – 4 Sundays - \$941 each agency

- 1.) Feed My People – (\$950 grocery gift cards) Provides emergency food and many other social services to the poor in South County.
- 2.) Whole Kids Outreach – Provides health and wellness services in five poverty stricken rural counties in southern Missouri, with a goal of preventing child abuse.
- 3.) Women's Place – Provides non-residential, drop-in care for survivors of domestic and/or sexual abuse in the St. Louis region. Their mission is to promote the safety and well-being of women through systemic change.
- 4.) St. Pius V Immigrant & Refugee Program – Direct outreach to immigrants and refugees around St. Pius V parish. Direct services provided to the poor including medicine, rent, and clothing on an emergency basis.
- 5.) English Tutoring Project – Supports the teaching of English to children from immigrant and refugee families at four Catholic elementary schools in the metro area.
- 6.) People to People – Direct aid, including medical, food and water, to the people in Haiti (80% live in direct poverty).

April 2018 – 5 Sundays - \$956 each agency

- 1.) St. Augustine Wellston Center—Helps support the members of the former 5 parish communities that merged to become St. Augustine Parish. Services include a food pantry, thrift store, employment counseling, health services and a GED program.
- 2.) Mary Ryder Home – serves St. Louis' most vulnerable senior women, nourishing their social, physical and emotional needs, and enhancing their quality of life through compassionate care.
- 3.) St. Peter and Paul Meals Program – Feeds poor and homeless in the community. Donations are used for food and supplies.
- 4.) Let's Start - Assists women who are discharged from prison to face the challenge of integrating back into society, with support for housing, education, counseling, and job searches.
- 5.) Missouri Catholic Conference – Catholic Church's advocacy group in Jefferson City promotes the inclusion of Catholic teaching in state legislation. Speaking together they influence public policy to represent issues important to the beliefs of our faith.
- 6.) Holy Trinity Parish – Assists an inner city parish in the Hyde Park area in its efforts to revitalize the neighborhood.
- 7.) Lemay Child and Family Center – Provides early care and education to children in a diverse, nurturing environment, and strengthens families by promoting children's physical health, cognitive, and social-emotional development.

As a committee under that commission, Citizens Against Pornography is very appreciative of the assistance, advice and service offered by the commission and its chair.

Congratulations to Karen Karr, the new chair of the Christian Formation Commission. The members of Citizens Against Pornography look forward to working with Karen over the next two years.

Since providing its first educational forum on human trafficking in October 2013, much attention has been paid to this growing problem. Legislation to stem this problem has been enacted in Congress and in Missouri.

Human trafficking is a form of modern day slavery. Its victims are subject to sexual exploitation or forced labor. Citizens Against Pornography proposes having another forum on human trafficking during this coming October. Watch the bulletin and *Update* for more information.
