Last month, I wrote about routines, and how life can become a series of them. Plenty of our routines are good and necessary to make it through the day. When we get into a routine, especially a comfortable one, it becomes even harder to change. What then do we do when that routine doesn't give us the results that we want? Do we adjust the routine, or adjust the expectations?

In an effort to improve the way we provide information, and get people signed up for important tasks and events, we have improved the routine. Flocknote, the new E-Mail system now being used by Mary Mother, will improve the communication process parish-wide. This system will allow E-Mail to be sent out without the threat of being blocked by your e-mail provider. If you are not getting this currently, please go to the Mary Mother website and put in your information under the flocknote signup.

The second improvement is the Sign-Up Genius. This electronic tool allows the sender (usually the parish office) to send a sign up list to the parish, or groups in the parish. By clicking and typing the requested information, you are signed up; and the sender has a name and count for that event. If you are in charge of an event, please use this great tool; it will make your job easier. Contact the office with the details of your event and it will be sent out. If you have the opportunity to sign up for something new, please do. We want and need your participation.

## LITURGY NOTES

As most parishioners are aware, Mary Mother is steeped in a tradition of singing since the early days of the parish. One way that we express that is by singing the “Glory to God” or “Gloria” at each weekend Mass and for Holy Days.

Some history of the Gloria from the *General Instruction of the Roman Missal*: “The Gloria is a very ancient and venerable hymn in which the Church, gathered together in the Holy Spirit, glorifies and entreats God the Father and the Lamb. The text of this hymn may not be replaced by any other text. If not sung, it is recited.”

Some commentary on the ‘Gloria’ by liturgist Elaine Rendler-McQueeney: “the primary liturgical acclamations include the Gospel Acclamation, the Holy, the Mystery of Faith, the Amen, and the Lamb of God. **But the Gloria is not an acclamation, it is a hymn. Consider varying the setting or style of the Gloria seasonally.**” This is what we do at Mary Mother. **We change the Mass settings and the Gloria five times a year according to the seasons as follows:** 1) Advent/Christmas; 2) Winter Ordinary Time/Lent; 3) Easter; 4) Summer Ordinary Time; 5) Fall Ordinary Time. **Our next change begins after Labor Day. With this cycle we keep our singing fresh and avoid a habit of undue repetition.**

“There’ll be some changes made” coming very soon. We are in the process of changing our Ministry scheduling to a computer-based program that will handle scheduling and tracking of attendance. Some of the advantages we hope to see with this new system include the following:

1. Ability to avoid scheduling Ministers to multiple, and, therefore conflicting, ministries for the same weekend. As an example; not scheduling someone to be an Adult Server and a Eucharistic Minister at the same Mass.
2. Enable Ministers to request a substitute with the click of a mouse automatically sending a request to other Ministers to fill that opening.
3. In the future, individual Ministers will be able to identify the weeks that they cannot serve.
4. Ministers will receive a midweek email to remind them of their weekend service.

The Administration and Finance Commission did not have a July meeting. The end of the fiscal year audit is complete but not yet available. The commission has received the June accounting report. Once again the parish is in a positive financial position. It is anticipated that the same result will be shown when the end of the fiscal year audit becomes available to Mary Mother.

The Administration and Finance sub-committee is working on the balance of the parish emergency response. The emergency response for the PSR classroom areas was previously completed. The committee is developing an emergency response plan for the church.

All major projects for 2018 are complete or in the process of being completed:

- Parish hall sound system and video system is complete.
- Change of the mechanical system from electric to natural gas is under way.
- Replacement of the classroom dividers is in progress. It is anticipated to be complete prior to the start of PSR.
- Flooring at the stairs and classroom corridor and the office of the Director of Religious Education is complete.
- Carpeting for the classrooms is scheduled after the classroom dividers are completed; it is anticipated to be completed prior to the start of PSR.
- Water heater in the sacristy is complete.



MMOC Vincentians volunteered 802 hours of service and traveled 1732 miles in the second quarter of 2018, recycling scrap metal and visiting 69 members in 26 home visits. Three members are now working at the Thrift Store to earn voucher credit so the neighbors we serve can obtain clothing and household items at no cost to our conference. This year we also applied for and received 10 grants for energy assistance from Heat Up St. Louis. This will save our conference \$4100 and keep the electricity on for our families.

Because of your contributions, we have been able to prevent several evictions and assist neighbors with the following expenses:

On August 7, the Coalition for Life held their annual meeting highlighting past, present and future activities. The event had approximately **800** in attendance! The coalition supports, The 40 Days for Life, Life Squad, Life Intern and Women’s Care Network. Due to these programs and others, abortions have been coming down in St Louis. In 2009 the number of abortions totaled 6,881; in 2016 the number totaled 4,502; and in 2017 it totaled 3,903 abortions.
