In 1986, Archbishop May called for the first convocation of the presbyterate of St. Louis; and we have been gathering every 4 years since then. The Convocation has been an opportunity for the priests of the archdiocese to work together, pray together and enjoy one another's company for 5 days. To encourage attendance, and to hopefully prevent running back and forth to the parish for a meeting, etc., our convocations have been held at Tan-Tar-A. There is an opening activity on Monday evening, with a full working day and evening on Tuesday, a working half-day on Wednesday, a full day on Thursday and a sending forth on Friday. As our numbers grow smaller, and, especially considering the recent revelations of accusations and cover-ups, this Convocation is much needed and timely.

The dates for the Convocation are **Monday, October 8 through Friday, October 12**. Please pray for all of us who can attend Convocation 2018.

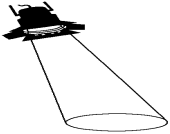

Once again, for the **Sundays of October**, we put our attention on Respecting Life. **Our focus is “Life Has Purpose.”** **October 7 is *Respect Life Sunday*.** We acknowledge the **importance of life from conception to advanced age.** At each Mass, we have a ceremony during the gathering rite to show respect for human life and to demonstrate **our relationship to the ministry of Birthright.** **In the Scriptures, Jesus said: “Let the children come to me...for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these.”** Let us remember to respect and guard all of creation especially those who cannot speak for themselves: the unborn children.

On the second Sunday of the month, **October 14**, we call attention to the ***White Ribbons Against Pornography Campaign (W.R.A.P.)***. This draws our prayers towards the importance of the dignity of every person, especially when it comes to a healthy respect for our bodies and our sexuality.

Blood pressure checks are a necessary way of knowing how well our blood vessels are tolerating the pressure of our heartbeats and at rest, between beats. Not everyone "feels" high blood pressure, so be sure to get it checked regularly.

Vincent Gray Alternative High School – Provides an education for poor, at-risk young men and women in a supportive and respectful atmosphere.

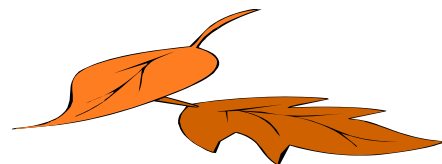

THANK YOU for all who helped make the Saint John's Football Booster drive a success. Mary Mother sold 267 tickets, 60+ tickets more than last year. If you still want to purchase a ticket, they are available in the parish office.

A financial report was included in the September 9th weekly bulletin, showing a very positive financial position.

The administration and finance subcommittee is developing an emergency response for the church. It is anticipated that the first phase of the emergency response will be completed in October. The EMR team has discussed with the Saint Louis County Department of Transport the dangerous condition exiting from Mary Mother of the Church. A traffic study is being conducted by the Department of Transport.

The following major projects for 2018 are in process of being completed

- Carpeting for the classrooms is ordered and will be installed when received
- Window shades for the classrooms

The major projects for 2019 are being reviewed. The scope of work and cost data are being compiled for a final determination of what items will be included in the 2019 budget. The solar panel lease agreement will expire in May of 2019. The committee is reviewing the various options that are available.

Our meetings are open to anyone who wishes to attend. They are held on the third Tuesday of the month in the church meeting room at 6:00 PM.

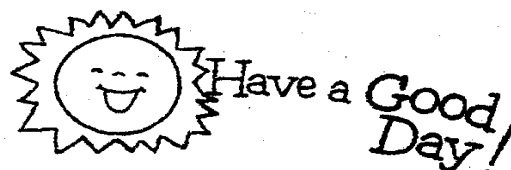
