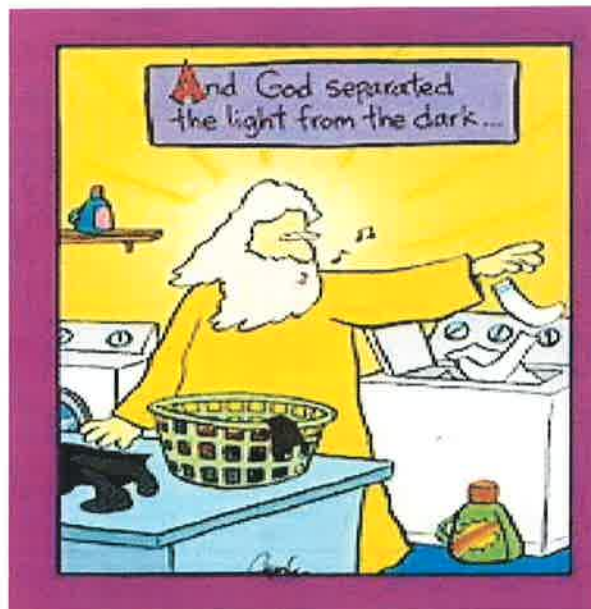

Greetings,

By now you've undoubtedly heard through various media reports that there are a number of candidates running for the position of Trustee for both the Windsor-Essex Catholic District School Board and the Greater Essex County District School Board who are suggesting either a merger of administrations of the two boards, or the complete elimination of publicly-funded Catholic education altogether.

Given the importance of this issue and with the October 22nd municipal election just days away, we felt it was imperative for us as spiritual and academic leaders to reach out to our Catholic community, to reaffirm our commitment to providing top-quality Catholic education for those families who believe this is a priority for their children, and to ask those families to speak up on behalf of publicly-funded Catholic education.

Despite what some may suggest, our schools are still very much faith-filled and inclusive environments. Every morning, more than 20,000 students enter Catholic schools in Windsor-Essex where we begin every day with prayer. Catholic virtues and values are threaded throughout our curriculum, and we hold regular masses for students in our schools and in our churches. We encourage our students to put their faith into practice by reaching out to help make our communities better places. Our Catholic faith is a fundamental component of everything we do in our schools.

Our teachers, administrators, campus ministers, local clergy, faith teams and other staff members share a common goal: to understand and know each student, in order to better promote their intellectual and spiritual well-being. The evidence proves that our approach works: our student achievement results are consistently well above provincial averages, as are our graduation rates.

Our Trustees and administrators work very hard to make sure that we are fiscally responsible stewards of our resources and that we are devoting them to providing innovative, inclusive, academic and faith-filled experiences for our students, especially our most vulnerable. The fact that our enrolment numbers are improving and that more families of a variety of faiths are choosing Catholic education demonstrates that people have faith in what we have to offer their children.

We believe that publicly-funded Catholic education is viable and relevant for those families who want all of the virtues associated with faith-based learning for their children. If you agree, we hope that you'll voice your support for Catholic education on October 22nd.
