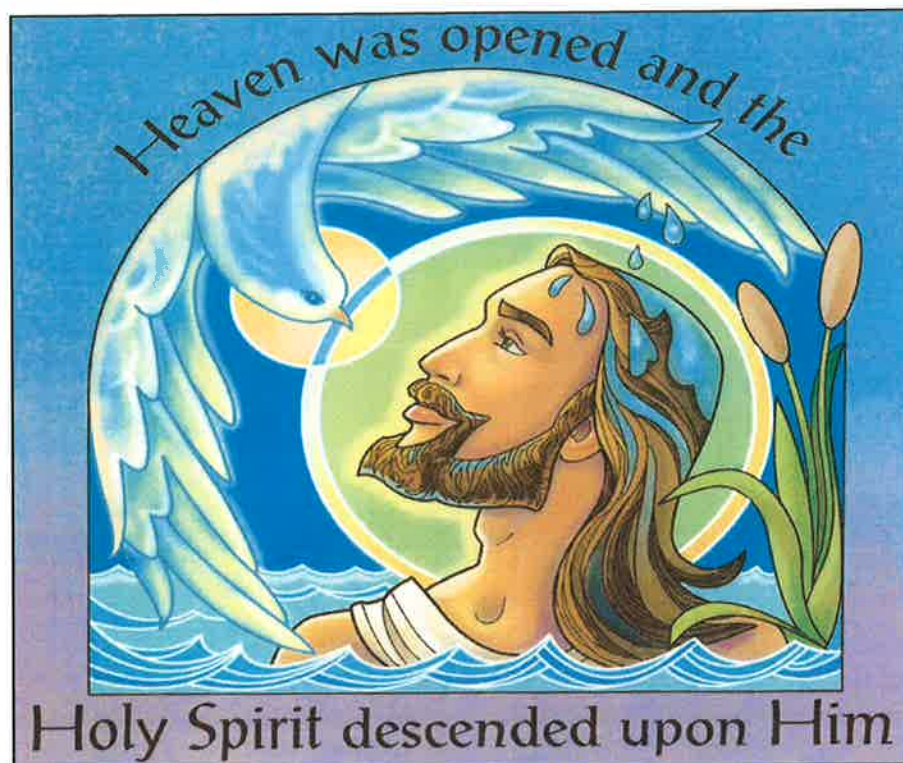

We, the faith community of St. John Vianney Church, celebrating the Eucharist as the centre of our faith, are committed to living out the Word of God in our homes, schools and community.

Dear Friends,

Today we celebrate the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. Liturgically, the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord brings an end to the Season of Christmas. Jesus had no need of baptism of course, he was sinless. However, He enters the Jordan to show solidarity with sinners. My friends, that includes you and me. On the cross He takes upon him Himself all of our burdens and sins. Christ's baptism inaugurates His public ministry. Today, we remember the Baptism of Jesus, His public embrace of His mission from the Father, and His solidarity with the human family. After John baptised Jesus in the Waters of the Jordan, the Son of God rose up to hear a heavenly confirmation from the voice of God: "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased." At our own baptism, God says the same to us. "You are my beloved daughter, you are my beloved son. We are anointed with holy oils; we wear a white garment and we are given a lighted candle to keep the flame of faith burning brightly in our hearts. This is a good day to check our candles of faith and make sure they are still burning brightly. Today, we are reminded that our baptism calls us to share in Christ's priestly, prophetic and kingly mission.

Bishop Fabbro has announced that our Family of Parishes will be activated in July of this year. Our Family of Parishes includes: Our Lady of the Atonement Parish, St. John Vianney Parish, St. Vincent de Paul Parish and St. Anthony of Padua Hungarian Parish who worship at St. Vincent de Paul Church. The Bishop has also announced that Father Robert Rocheleau will be appointed Pastor of our Family and I will be appointed Associate Pastor. (Father Barnabas Kiss, O.F.M., will continue to serve the Hungarian community.) These appointments take effect in July. In the interim, Father Rob will be working closely with the staff from the three sites and a Transition Team. There is much preparation needed as we plan for the activation of our Family. Please keep Father Rob in your prayers and all of us who are part of our new Family grouping. Bishop Fabbro said, "As we embark on a whole new model for our parishes, we need to keep foremost in our minds the heart of our mission: the joyful proclamation of the Good News of God's immense, merciful love. All of our efforts are to be oriented to this mission, directed to this mission, focussed on this mission."
