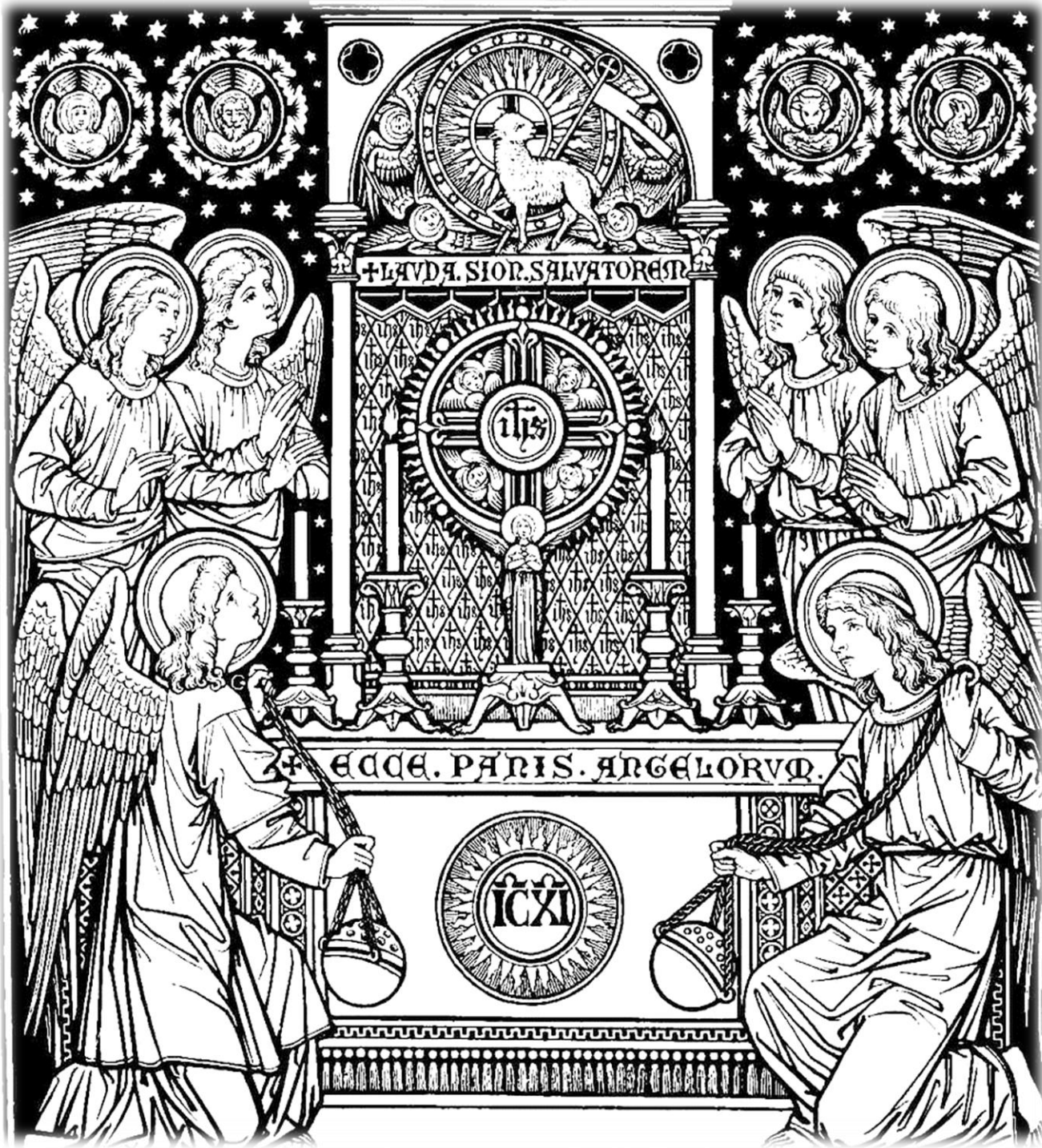

**Notice to Parishioners
from Father Antonio**

As you might already know, a month ago the City of Boston notified the Archdiocese that the fire escapes at Sacred Heart Church were overdue for inspection. The parish, with the help of the Archdiocese, retained the services of a structural engineer. It was found that the emergency fire exits from the Church are inadequate. Some of the exits end up in a small courtyard that is enclosed with buildings and therefore, in case of fire or any other emergencies, lives would be threatened.

A meeting took place on Friday, May 31st between the property manager and engineer from the Archdiocese, an architect, a parishioner and myself. Under the advice of the Risk Management Department of the Archdiocese of Boston, we have been told to suspend any activities whatsoever at Sacred Heart Church until proper corrections to the fire exits has been implemented.

We have immediately pursued advice from an architect to come up with possible solutions to correct the deficiencies with the emergency exits at Sacred Heart Church.

As I believe in open communication with the community and parishioners, I pledge to bring all information to you immediately upon receiving it.

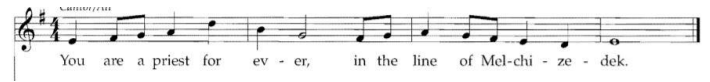

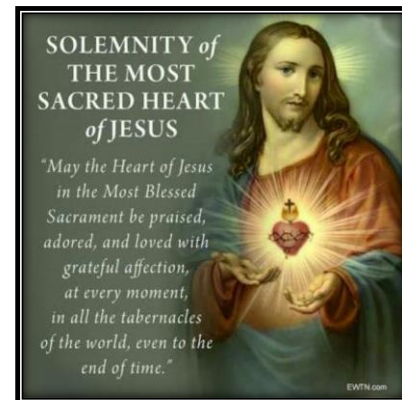
