Saint Elizabeth of Portugal

Elizabeth of Aragon, or Saint Elizabeth of Portugal, was a medieval queen who devoted her life to the poor and sick. At the age of 12 she was given in marriage to King Denis of Portugal. Legend has it that he disapproved of her charitable works with the needy.



One evening she was carrying several loaves of bread under her skirts to give to the poor. Her husband had forbidden her from visiting them in person and thus he was not happy about her sneaking around. When she undid her dress to reveal what was hidden in it, bread was nowhere in sight, instead red roses fell from the folds of her dress.

Her humble manner and religious piety were well remembered, resulting in her beatification in 1526. Nearly a century later she was canonized by Pope Urban VIII on the 25th of May 1625.

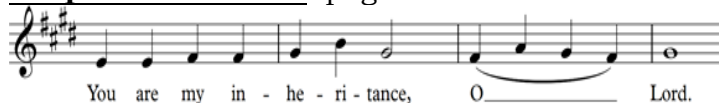
