From Our Pastor: PRIVATE REVELATION: REFLECTIONS ON POPE BENEDICT XVI'S VERBUM DOMINI

Because Jesus is the Word of God made flesh, he is the final statement of God's revelation of himself. In Christ, he has said everything he wanted to say. St. John of the Cross describes it likes this: "Since he has given us his Son, his only word (for he possesses no other), he spoke everything at once in this sole word—and he has no more to say ... because what he spoke before to the prophets in parts, he has spoken all at once by giving us this All who is his Son. Any person questioning God or desiring some vision or revelation would be guilty not only of foolish behavior but also of offending him, by not fixing his eyes entirely on Christ and by living with the desire for some other novelty."

This is a lot to take in so let's break it down. The whole Old Testament is the prelude to Christ, a whispering of God's full self-revelation, like seeing a picture of someone before meeting them, or hearing their name. Everything the Father had to say to us came through Christ. God has no more to say. This is called public revelation and is contained in Sacred Scripture and Sacred Tradition, of which the Church is the guardian. Public revelation is finished. There will be no more. Granted, we are 2000 years out from God's last word, and we're still not even close to understanding it all. In fact, we will probably still be unpacking it till the end of time. So much was said, and Christ even spoke, then, 2000 years ago, to our experience today, so great was the Word spoken.

The Synod Fathers recommended that the Holy Father also speak about private revelation. "Yet even if revelation is already complete, it has not been made completely explicit; it remains for Christian faithful to grasp its full significance over the course of the centuries." Throughout the history of the Church, men and women have experienced private revelation, a message from God only for them. Two examples are the *Dialogue of St. Catherine of Siena*, which details a series of conversations she has with Christ and the Blessed Virgin Mary in prayer, and the words given to the children by the Blessed Virgin Mary at Fatima.

Pope Benedict wants to make clear how we are to address private revelation. "The value of private revelations is essentially different from that of the one public revelation: the latter demands faith; in it God himself speaks to us through human words and the mediation of the living community of the Church. The criterion for judging the truth of a private revelation is its orientation to Christ himself," (VD, 14). A private revelation needs to be checked alongside the public revelation of Scripture and Tradition. The two private


revelations I spoke of above have received approval from the Church, which basically means they don't say anything contrary to the faith.

For us more practically, we might hear someone say, "God told me such and such" from a person we respect or secondhand from someone we respect. (We wouldn't value such talk from someone we don't respect, but the rules for evaluation are nonetheless the same.) We must ask the question, "Is what he/she says in line with the teaching of the Church?" If not, avoid it. It should never take the place of or supersede Christ, but needs to always be seen in relation to him. That being said, private revelation can be greatly helpful. "A private revelation can introduce new emphases, give rise to new forms of piety, or deepen older ones. It can have a certain prophetic character (cf. 1 Th 5:19-21) and can be a valuable aid for better understanding and living the Gospel at a certain time," (VD, 14). The devotion to the Sacred Heart and Divine Mercy sprang from private revelation. The resurgence of the lay faithful praying a daily rosary sprang from the private revelations at Lourdes and Fatima. They can be of great help in the growth of the virtue of faith.

Whereas Christ demands our faith as the Word of God, private revelation and its use carries no obligation, only invitation. If it nourishes your faith, great. If it doesn't, that's okay too.
