Eucharist - Sat Vigil: 5:00 p.m.; Sun: 8:00 a.m. & 10:45 a.m.; Daily Mass: M, W, Th, F at 12 noon; First Saturday ONLY is at 8:00 a.m.; (Holydays - See special announcement in bulletin)

Penance - Sat: 4:30-4:45 p.m.; Sun: 7:30-7:45 a.m. & 10:15-10:30 a.m. (and by appt.)

Baptism - A preparation class is required of the parents requesting Baptism for their first child. Parents and godparents are encouraged to attend the class before the baby's birth. (Scheduled as needed.)

Confirmation - Confirmation is celebrated in the spring with students who are at least in the 8<sup>th</sup> grade and have completed the requirements for the preparation process in our PRE program.

Matrimony - Couples planning to marry should contact the Pastor at least 5 months prior to the proposed date so all parish and diocesan requirements may be completed.

Holy Orders - If you feel called to a vocation in the priesthood or religious life, please contact the pastor.

Anointing of the Sick - If you wish to receive this sacrament, contact the pastor. If there is an emergency situation, an immediate family member should contact the pastor.

**APRIL – MONTH OF THE HOLY EUCHARIST** During the month of April, we give special honor to the Holy Eucharist. The Eucharist, the Second Vatican Council taught us, is “the source and summit of the Christian life” (*Lumen gentium, 11*). What does that mean? It means that our participation in the Eucharist is the source from which we draw our strength to live as Jesus taught and to serve in his name. It is also the summit, the high point of our communal life. We use the word “Eucharist” to describe our celebration of the Mass. We use the same word when we speak of the Sacrament of Christ’s Body and Blood. In this month of the Holy Eucharist, let us participate more fully and actively in the Church’s liturgy, our celebration of the Eucharist. And let us take time, too, for quiet adoration in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament, and become more aware of the wondrous way Christ comes to us in the Eucharist.

### 2018-2019 PRE Registration Information

1. The Discount Deadline for the 2018-2019 PRE Registration is 3:00 pm on July 5, 2018. Tuition on or before July 5, 2018 is \$25 for the first child, and \$5 for each remaining child in the family. Tuition after July 5, 2018 is \$30 for the first child, and \$10 for each remaining child in the family.
2. 2018-2019 PRE Registration Deadline is 3:00 pm on July 25, 2018. The only registrations that will be accepted after this deadline will be for newly registered families moving into the area.
3. Classes begin on Sunday, August 12, 2018. **\*Note: All PRE classes are held on Sunday morning.**
4. 2018-2019 PRE Registration Packets can be found on the shelves in the foyer under the bulletin board and on the website. **A completed PRE registration form, a Medical Release Form and a Media Permission Form are required EACH year for EACH student** registering for PRE. All three forms are included in the registration packet. **\*\*Note: If your child has received a sacrament (Baptism, 1<sup>st</sup> Penance, 1<sup>st</sup> Communion, Confirmation) or has made a Profession of Faith in a Catholic Church other than Holy Angels, please attach a copy of the sacramental certificate to the registration packet.**
5. 1<sup>st</sup> Penance/1<sup>st</sup> Communion Registration Packets will be handed out and discussed with the students and their parents at the **MANDATORY** Parent/Student Meeting on Sunday, August 19, 2018 at 9:30 a.m. in the parish hall
6. Confirmation Registration Packets and Service hour information will be handed out and discussed with the 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grades students and their parents at the **MANDATORY** Parent/Student Meeting on Sunday, August 26, 2018. The meetings will be held in the 7<sup>th</sup> & 8<sup>th</sup> grade classrooms.
7. Also, keep in mind the diocesan requirement that students registering for a sacrament (1<sup>st</sup> Penance, 1<sup>st</sup> Communion, Confirmation) must have attended PRE here or somewhere else the prior year in order to register for the sacrament. These students must also provide a copy of the certificate for all sacraments already received.
8. Service Scholarship applications can be found on the PRE bulletin board in the PRE hall at the canopy entrance and on the website.
9. **All PRE registrations packets and sacramental class registration packets are to be turned in to Mr. Pete Hinkel in the parish office.** For your convenience, registration packets/tuition can be dropped off at the parish office, mailed to the parish office or dropped in either of the secure drop boxes provided. (1. On the wall next to the mailbox outside, or 2. On the wall next to Pete Hinkel's office.)

**Easter Sunday of the Resurrection of the Lord (ABC)**  
**April 1, 2018**

**APRIL – Month of the Holy Eucharist**

The celebration of the Resurrection of Jesus Christ continues into Easter Sunday morning. Easter Sunday marks the end of the Triduum and is the first day of the Easter Octave. The celebration of the Triduum concludes after Vespers and the great fifty days begin. Forty days of fast yield to fifty days of feast. On Easter Sunday, many of those who were present the night before return, especially the neophytes. In addition, there may be many people attending who have not been to church in a while.

**FIRST READING** (Acts of the Apostles 10:34a, 37-43) Peter and Cornelius received a divinely inspired vision that led them to one another. They must have recognized the gift of that grace because it was extremely unlikely that a Jew (Peter) would be a guest in a Gentile home. What they heard remains ours today as we hear the First Reading: Jesus of Nazareth, anointed by God with the Holy Spirit, healed many people. He was put to death but was raised by God. We have seen him and have eaten with him. He has sent us to preach this Good News. And this is the truth we speak to you today: "Everyone who believes in him will receive forgiveness of sins through his name." Peter took a very bold step that day to broaden the mission of the followers of Jesus. Because of the vision he received, Peter had come to believe that all people were to be included in the great work of preaching the story of Jesus Christ. The Good News could not and should not be contained, for it is meant for all people for all time.

**RESPONSORIAL PSALM** (Psalm 118:1-2, 16-17, 22-23) The psalmist gives voice to the great joy of the people, expressing their overwhelming gratitude for the faithfulness of the Lord. This is the last of five consecutive Hallel or Alleluia Psalms that were used at special feasts and most especially at Passover. The verses we pray this Sunday are particularly suited for Easter as they proclaim God's triumph experienced in the lifetime of the believer. As we celebrate the promise that we shall not die, but live, the psalm also reminds us of our responsibility to proclaim the works of the Lord.

**SECOND READING** (Option 1: Colossians 3:1-4) The Colossians reading urges us to die to self in order to focus on the Lord, for having been baptized in Christ, the concerns of the world should diminish in meaning. For those who are caught up in the things of this world, however, this reading is an invitation to reorder our lives. On the day of glory, the worldly things that can consume human hearts will have no significance. (Option 2: 1 Corinthians 5:6b-8) Some have called this Corinthians reading the first Easter sermon. Leading up to this passage, Paul has chastised the people for their wicked behavior. Now he makes it clear that to honor the Paschal sacrifice and live as the new life demands, Christians have a responsibility to one another to live with sincerity and truth.

**GOSPEL** (John 20:1-9) Mary Magdalene is the first person at the tomb in all four Gospel accounts. In John's account of the Gospel, the anointing of the body has already taken place, but Mary is still the first person on record to go to the tomb. She is the messenger who then brings Peter and the Beloved Disciple to see that the stone has been moved. Cloths lay on the ground, the head cloth arranged in a separate place, all to indicate that this is not the scene of a robbery. Time and future appearances of the Lord will add believers to the community.

**REFLECTION** It's hard when we have incredible news and no one believes. What would excite those around you about God's love or how can you be an instrument to simply bring a huge smile to someone's face? Bringing their favorite treat, doing something simple but unexpected, treating a stranger. Be creative in sharing great news each day this week. And, while we each may want to be in the spotlight and know we are loved, be conscious to be humble and allow another to shine (like Simon Peter) even if they always seem to be in the light.
