Sacraments

Eucharist - Sat Vigil: 5:00 p.m.; Sun: 8:00 a.m. & 10:45 a.m.; Daily Mass: M, W, Th, F at 12 noon; First Saturday ONLY is at 8:00 a.m.; (Holydays - See special announcement in bulletin)

Penance - Sat: 4:30-4:45 p.m.; Sun: 7:30-7:45 a.m. & 10:15-10:30 a.m. (and by appt.)

Baptism - A preparation class is required of the parents requesting Baptism for their first child. Parents and godparents are encouraged to attend the class before the baby's birth. (Scheduled as needed.)

Confirmation - Confirmation is celebrated in the spring with students who are at least in the 8th grade and have completed the requirements for the preparation process in our PRE program.

Matrimony - Couples planning to marry should contact the Pastor at least 5 months prior to the proposed date so all parish and diocesan requirements may be completed.

Holy Orders - If you feel called to a vocation in the priesthood or religious life, please contact the pastor.

Anointing of the Sick - If you wish to receive this sacrament, contact the pastor. If there is an emergency situation, an immediate family member should contact the pastor.

2018-2019 PRE Registration Information

1. The Discount Deadline for the 2018-2019 PRE Registration is 3:00 pm on July 5, 2018. Tuition on or before July 5, 2018 is \$25 for the first child, and \$5 for each remaining child in the family. Tuition after July 5, 2018 is \$30 for the first child, and \$10 for each remaining child in the family.
2. 2018-2019 PRE Registration Deadline is 3:00 pm on July 25, 2018. The only registrations that will be accepted after this deadline will be for newly registered families moving into the area.
3. Classes begin on Sunday, August 12, 2018. ***Note: All PRE classes are held on Sunday morning.**
4. 2018-2019 PRE Registration Packets can be found on the shelves in the foyer under the bulletin board and on the website. **A completed PRE registration form, a Medical Release Form and a Media Permission Form are required EACH year for EACH student** registering for PRE. All three forms are included in the registration packet. ****Note: If your child has received a sacrament (Baptism, 1st Penance, 1st Communion, Confirmation) or has made a Profession of Faith in a Catholic Church other than Holy Angels, please attach a copy of the sacramental certificate to the registration packet.**
5. 1st Penance/1st Communion Registration Packets will be handed out and discussed with the students and their parents at the **MANDATORY** Parent/Student Meeting on Sunday, August 19, 2018 at 9:30 a.m. in the parish hall
6. Confirmation Registration Packets and Service hour information will be handed out and discussed with the 7th and 8th grades students and their parents at the **MANDATORY** Parent/Student Meeting on Sunday, August 26, 2018. The meetings will be held in the 7th & 8th grade classrooms.
7. Also, keep in mind the diocesan requirement that students registering for a sacrament (1st Penance, 1st Communion, Confirmation) must have attended PRE here or somewhere else the prior year in order to register for the sacrament. These students must also provide a copy of the certificate for all sacraments already received.
8. Service Scholarship applications can be found on the PRE bulletin board in the PRE hall at the canopy entrance and on the website.
9. **All PRE registrations packets and sacramental class registration packets are to be turned in to Mr. Pete Hinkel in the parish office.** For your convenience, registration packets/tuition can be dropped off at the parish office, mailed to the parish office or dropped in either of the secure drop boxes provided. (1. On the wall next to the mailbox outside, or 2. On the wall next to Pete Hinkel's office.)

5th Sunday of Easter (B) April 28/29, 2018

APRIL – Month of the Holy Eucharist

FIRST READING (Acts of the Apostles 9:26-31) After Saul accepts Jesus as the long awaited Jewish Messiah, he goes to Jerusalem to connect with the disciples. Because of his history, they are afraid of him until Barnabas speaks well of Saul, his acceptance of Jesus and his preaching in Jesus' name. Once accepted, Saul speaks out boldly and debates with Hellenists who are so upset at him that they try to kill him. With help Saul escapes to Caesarea and returns to his hometown of Tarsus. Despite all this, Luke claims that the Church is at peace, growing, being built up and accompanied by the Spirit's wisdom and guidance. Even amidst apparent dissension, the Spirit's peace and wisdom continues to embrace Jesus' followers both then and now.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM (Psalm 22:26-27, 28, 30, 31-32)

This lament psalm speaks of the psalmist feeling abandoned by God, alone in life's sufferings. Despite such feelings of abandonment, the psalmist turns to God, realizing that God is the only hope. In today's verses, the psalmist already anticipates God's help and promises to fulfill the vows made to God, especially in caring for the poor and needy. Confident that God will answer and relieve the suffering, the psalmist praises God and promises to let all generations, past, present, and to come, know of God's justice, care and love. Saul in our First Reading could have easily prayed this prayer and so can we.

SECOND READING (1 John 3:18-24) This passage, rich in Trinitarian theology, invites all to "love not in word or speech but in deed and truth." God does not condemn us but desires us to trust that, if we keep the Commandments, we will receive all that we ask for. Keeping God's Commandments, demands that we believe in Jesus and love one another in the same

manner that Jesus loved us. In so doing, we are assured, through the Spirit gifted to us, that we will remain in Jesus and he in us. Such divine intimacy with Father, Son and Spirit is a treasured gift that must be continually cultivated if it is to impact our daily lives.

GOSPEL (John 15:1-8) Jesus' "I AM" statement, "I am the vine, you are the branches," speaks of intimacy and fruitfulness in discipleship. It we are to produce rich fruit, we have to be not only connected to Jesus, the life-giving vine, but we also have to be open to being pruned by the Father, the vine-grower. Being pruned involves living according to Jesus' words and actions. Those who choose otherwise will wither and die. In believing and living the Jesus lifestyle, we will have intimacy with Jesus, be fruitful and life-giving, and give honor to God, who will be receptive to all that we ask for. This was a good program for disciples then and continues to be a rich program now for all who desire to be disciples.

THE ROMAN MISSAL Even though we are at the 5th Sunday of Easter, the season is still reverberating with joy and enthusiasm of the sacramental initiation that occurred at the Easter Vigil: the Collect makes explicit reference to "those you [God] were pleased to make new in Holy Baptism." The prayer goes on to ask that those newly baptized will "bear much fruit / and come to the joys of life eternal." The meaning of Baptism continues to be center-stage in the liturgical theology of Easter Time. The Prayer over the Offerings, using the important notion of "the wonderful exchange effected in this sacrifice," prays that we might truly come to live the divine life we encounter in the exchange: "that, as we have come to know your truth, / we may make it ours by a worthy way of life." The Prayer after Communion speaks of the ongoing dynamic quality of a life lived dying and rising in Christ, a dynamism animated by the Eucharistic food, as it asks that God be with us to "lead those who have imbued with heavenly mysteries to pass from former ways to newness of life."
