Sacraments

Eucharist - Sat Vigil: 5:00 p.m.; Sun: 8:00 a.m. & 10:45 a.m.; Daily Mass: M, W, Th, F at 12 noon; First Saturday ONLY is at 8:00 a.m.; (Holydays - See special announcement in bulletin)

Penance - Sat: 4:30-4:45 p.m.; Sun: 7:30-7:45 a.m. & 10:15-10:30 a.m. (and by appt.)

Baptism - A preparation class is required of the parents requesting Baptism for their first child. Parents and godparents are encouraged to attend the class before the baby's birth. (Scheduled as needed.)

Confirmation - Confirmation is celebrated in the spring with students who are at least in the 8th grade and have completed the requirements for the preparation process in our PRE program.

Matrimony - Couples planning to marry should contact the Pastor at least 5 months prior to the proposed date so all parish and diocesan requirements may be completed.

Holy Orders - If you feel called to a vocation in the priesthood or religious life, please contact the pastor.

Anointing of the Sick - If you wish to receive this sacrament, contact the pastor. If there is an emergency situation, an immediate family member should contact the pastor.

2018-2019 PRE Registration Information

1. The Discount Deadline for the 2018-2019 PRE Registration is 3:00 pm on July 5, 2018. Tuition on or before July 5, 2018 is \$25 for the first child, and \$5 for each remaining child in the family. Tuition after July 5, 2018 is \$30 for the first child, and \$10 for each remaining child in the family.
2. 2018-2019 PRE Registration Deadline is 3:00 pm on July 25, 2018. The only registrations that will be accepted after this deadline will be for newly registered families moving into the area.
3. Classes begin on Sunday, August 12, 2018. ***Note: All PRE classes are held on Sunday morning.**
4. 2018-2019 PRE Registration Packets can be found on the shelves in the foyer under the bulletin board and on the website. **A completed PRE registration form, a Medical Release Form and a Media Permission Form are required EACH year for EACH student** registering for PRE. All three forms are included in the registration packet. ****Note: If your child has received a sacrament (Baptism, 1st Penance, 1st Communion, Confirmation) or has made a Profession of Faith in a Catholic Church other than Holy Angels, please attach a copy of the sacramental certificate to the registration packet.**
5. 1st Penance/1st Communion Registration Packets will be handed out and discussed with the students and their parents at the **MANDATORY** Parent/Student Meeting on Sunday, August 19, 2018 at 9:30 a.m. in the parish hall
6. Confirmation Registration Packets and Service hour information will be handed out and discussed with the 7th and 8th grades students and their parents at the **MANDATORY** Parent/Student Meeting on Sunday, August 26, 2018. The meetings will be held in the 7th & 8th grade classrooms.
7. Also, keep in mind the diocesan requirement that students registering for a sacrament (1st Penance, 1st Communion, Confirmation) must have attended PRE here or somewhere else the prior year in order to register for the sacrament. These students must also provide a copy of the certificate for all sacraments already received.
8. Service Scholarship applications can be found on the PRE bulletin board in the PRE hall at the canopy entrance and on the website.
9. **All PRE registrations packets and sacramental class registration packets are to be turned in to Mr. Pete Hinkel in the parish office.** For your convenience, registration packets/tuition can be dropped off at the parish office, mailed to the parish office or dropped in either of the secure drop boxes provided. (1. On the wall next to the mailbox outside, or 2. On the wall next to Pete Hinkel's office.)

6th Sunday of Easter (B) May 5/6, 2015
MAY – Month of Our Lady

The assumption we can solve problems by violence can easily ruin us. Jesus said, "If you keep my commandments, you will remain in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and I remain in his love. I have told you this so that my joy may be in you and your joy may be complete" (John 15:10-11). Violence and fear come from hate, but peace and joy come from love; they are fruits of God's Spirit. We do not fear even disease because of Christ. After all, what would we have to lose?

FIRST READING (Acts of the Apostles 10:25-26, 34-35, 44-48) In entering the home of the Gentile Cornelius, Peter takes a radical step for a Jew. In a vision, Peter has come to an awareness of God's inclusive nature and boldly states that "God shows no partiality. Rather, in every nation, whoever fears him and acts uprightly, is acceptable to him." Peter is interrupted by the Spirit who proceeds to descent upon all. As Jewish believers are astounded that the Spirit is gifting both Gentiles and Jews, Peter responds by saying that if Gentiles are acceptable to the Lord, then who are we to stand in God's path. He orders

Cornelius and his entire household to be baptized. Often we too need to scrutinize our beliefs and actions to make certain that we are not standing in God's path.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM (Psalm 98:1, 2-3, 3-4) Jumping off Peter and the Baptism of Cornelius's household, the psalm revels in the fact that "the Lord has revealed to the nations his saving power." All are invited to sing a new song to the Lord who has done wondrous deeds by making salvation and justice known and available to all people. God's covenant love and faithfulness are made known to Israel and to all the ends of the earth. Such inclusiveness calls for new joyful songs that all can sing. We would do well to examine our own inclusiveness and that of our communities.

SECOND READING (1 John 4:7-10) We are exhorted to love one another because love is of God and whoever loves knows God and is begotten by God. God is love. That love is clearly manifested by the Father taking the initiative in sending Jesus to show love's depth, even to the point of being willing to die for another. Whoever does not love, does not know God. Easter Time invites us to reflect on how we practically and realistically demonstrate our love of God.

GOSPEL (John 15:9-17) In his farewell address to his disciples, Jesus exhorts them to love one another as he has loved them. The depth of love is the willingness to die for the other. Jesus has chosen them, revealed all that the Father commanded him and promises to love them and remain in them. All he asks in return is to remain in him by loving one another. Intimacy with God rests on our willingness to believe in and imitate Jesus in loving one another even unto death. Our communities would certainly be different if we all took this message to heart in all our dealings and encounters.

THE ROMAN MISSAL The Collect situates this celebration within the ongoing festivity of the fifty days of Easter Time as it refers to our celebration "with heartfelt devotion of these days of joy, / which we keep in honor of the risen Lord." Also, the key connection between liturgy and life is affirmed as we ask "that what we relive in remembrance we may always hold to in what we do." The Prayer over the Offerings also prays for the liturgical celebration to have an ongoing effect in our lives as it petitions that "we may be conformed to the mysteries of your mighty love." Such transformation, however, is a result of God's grace, not our own efforts alone, as the prayer recognizes our need to be purified by God's graciousness. The Prayer after Communion affirms both that we have been restored to eternal life "in the Resurrection of Christ," and that we are asking for the "strength of this saving food" to bear fruit in our life. The prayer reminds us that our reception of Holy Communion should always have the effect of increasing our love for one another.
