Sacraments

Eucharist - Sat Vigil: 5:00 p.m.; Sun: 8:00 a.m. & 10:45 a.m.; Daily Mass: M, W, Th, F at 12 noon; First Saturday ONLY is at 8:00 a.m.; (Holydays - See special announcement in bulletin)

Penance - Sat: 4:30-4:45 p.m.; Sun: 7:30-7:45 a.m. & 10:15-10:30 a.m. (and by appt.)

Baptism - A preparation class is required of the parents requesting Baptism for their first child. Parents and godparents are encouraged to attend the class before the baby's birth. (Scheduled as needed.)

Confirmation - Confirmation is celebrated in the spring with students who are at least in the 8th grade and have completed the requirements for the preparation process in our PRE program.

Matrimony - Couples planning to marry should contact the Pastor at least 5 months prior to the proposed date so all parish and diocesan requirements may be completed.

Holy Orders - If you feel called to a vocation in the priesthood or religious life, please contact the pastor.

Anointing of the Sick - If you wish to receive this sacrament, contact the pastor. If there is an emergency situation, an immediate family member should contact the pastor.

2018-2019 PRE Registration Information

1. The Discount Deadline for the 2018-2019 PRE

Registration is 3:00 pm on July 5, 2018. Tuition on or before July 5, 2018 is \$25 for the first child, and \$5 for each remaining child in the family. Tuition after July 5, 2018 is \$30 for the first child, and \$10 for each remaining child in the family.


- 2. 2018-2019 PRE Registration Deadline is 3:00 pm on July 25, 2018. The only registrations that will be accepted after this deadline will be for newly registered families moving into the area.
- 3. Classes begin on Sunday, August 12, 2018. *Note: All PRE classes are held on Sunday morning.
- 4. 2018-2019 PRE Registration Packets can be found on the shelves in the foyer under the bulletin board and on the website. A completed PRE registration form, a Medical Release Form and a Medial Permission Form are required EACH year for EACH student registering for PRE. All three forms are included in the registration packet. **Note: If your child has received a sacrament (Baptism, 1st Penance, 1st Communion, Confirmation) or has made a Profession of Faith in a Catholic Church other than Holy Angels, please attach a copy of the sacramental certificate to the registration packet.
- 5. 1st Penance/1st Communion Registration Packets will be handed out and discussed with the students and their parents at the **MANDATORY** Parent/Student Meeting on Sunday, August 19, 2018 at 9:30 a.m. in the parish hall
- 6. Confirmation Registration Packets and Service hour information will be handed out and discussed with the 7th and 8th grades students and their parents at the **MANDATORY** Parent/Student Meeting on Sunday, August 26, 2018. The meetings will be held in the 7th & 8th grade classrooms.
- 7. Also, keep in mind the diocesan requirement that students registering for a sacrament (1st Penance, 1st Communion, Confirmation) must have attended PRE here or somewhere else the prior year in order to register for the sacrament. These students must also provide a copy of the certificate for all sacraments already received.
- 8. Service Scholarship applications can be found on the PRE bulletin board in the PRE hall at the canopy entrance and on the website.
- 9. All PRE registrations packets and sacramental class registration packets are to be turned in to Mr. Pete Hinkel in the parish office. For your convenience, registration packets/tuition can be dropped off at the parish office, mailed to the parish office or dropped in either of the secure drop boxes provided. (1. On the wall next to the mailbox outside, or 2. On the wall next to Pete Hinkel's office.)

Ministry to the Sick Eucharistic ministers bring the comfort of Christ in the form of the Eucharist to those who cannot come to church; they bring the Church to people. Your envelopes will remain on the altar the entire month of June.

<u>May 20th - Pentecost</u> As we celebrate Pentecost, it is important to remember the ongoing role of the Holy Spirit. It is the Spirit that inspired the authors of the Bible, it is the Spirit that guides those called on to interpret the Scriptures, and it is the Spirit that enables each of us to hear what God has to say.

May 20th — THE LAST PRE CLASS for the 2017-2018 school year will be Sunday, May 20th. Please make sure you get your child/children registered for the 2018-2019 school year before the deadlines.

Pentecost (B) 7th Sunday in Ordinary Time May 19/20, 2018 MAY – Month of Our Ladv

The Greek word for Pentecost (Pentekostē) means "fiftieth," and in early Christianity it referred to the entire Fifty Days of Easter. The roots of Pentecost can be found in the Jewish festival of Weeks (Shavu'ot), the Fifty-day celebration following Passover (Ex 23:16). It was a harvest festival in which the first fruits of the harvest were offered to God in gratitude. It eventually became associated with the giving of the Torah on Mount Sinai. Early Christians reinterpreted the Jewish festival as a commemoration of the coming of the Holy Spirit, since Acts records that the Holy Spirit came to the disciples when the festival of Pentecost was fulfilled (see Acts 2:1-11). The celebration of Pentecost may begin on Saturday afternoon or evening with the Vigil. By the end of the fourth century in the West, Pentecost became a time for the initiation of those not baptized at Easter. Thus, a night vigil was added like the Easter Vigil for this purpose.

FIRST READING (Acts 2:1-11) Pentecost was one of the three pilgrimage feasts of the Jews, when all who were able came to the Temple in Jerusalem; thus, the presence of so many foreigners in Jerusalem that day. All the disciples were gathered in one place. Acts 1:13-14 identifies these disciples as the Eleven, Mary, the mother of Jesus, the women who journeyed with Jesus from Galilee to Jerusalem and his relatives. The cosmic sign of the strong driving wind attracted the crowd. (In Greed, the language in which Acts was originally written, the same word is used for both "wind" and "spirit.") Note also the sign of "fire." The fruit of the Spirit's presence and work is the disciples' ability to proclaim the Gospel in various tongues and be understood by those who heard them.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM (Ps 104:1, 24, 29-30, 31, 34) As at the Vigil Mass, Psalm 104 is used, with the same antiphon. There is some variation in the stanzas. Today's addition in the last stanza voices the desire that both God's glory and God's joy in his creation endure. The psalmist is intent on being pleasing to the Lord and finding joy in him. A beautiful theme for each of our lives!

SECOND READING (1 Cor 12:3b-7, 12-13) The contrast between the Spirit and the flesh—and their respective fruits—is emphasized in today's reading. The flesh represents anything that is opposed to God; the Spirit, that which is enlivened by God's power and presence. Paul's command to live by the Spirit points to the choice we have in the matter. Which fruits are more evident in our lives?

GOSPEL (John 20:19-23) The setting of today's text is Jesus' last discourse to his disciples, at table with them the night before he died. Jesus promises to send the Spirit, an Advocate on their behalf and the Spirit of truth. Note the intimate workings between the Father, the Son, and the Spirit and how the disciples are drawn into this by the power of the Spirit at work in their lives. On their part, the disciples must receive what the Spirit declares to them and testify on Jesus' behalf.

REFLECTION Infused into every part of life to be made manifest in our daily lives, Jesus gives us each a great protector. Because of this we are powerful beings in Christ. Harness this beautiful power and accept your ability to truly make a difference in bold and beautiful ways. Consider downloading from World Library Publications, John Angotti's songs: "I Send you Out" or "Come, Holy Spirit" for both are true representation to feed

your soul about the message necessary to live as an empowered member of the Body of Christ. You are blessed to serve. Serve someone in Christ's name this week.

FINAL NOTES ABOUT THE END OF EASTER TIME After the last liturgy on Pentecost Sunday, with the return to Ordinary Time, the Paschal candle is extinguished. The candle now returns to its regular location in the baptistery and it is to reside there "with due honor" for its use at the celebration of Baptism.
