Sacraments

Eucharist - Sat Vigil: 5:00 p.m.; Sun: 8:00 a.m. & 10:45 a.m.; Daily Mass: M, W, Th, F at 12 noon; First Saturday ONLY is at 8:00 a.m.; (Holydays - See special announcement in bulletin)

Penance - Sat: 4:30-4:45 p.m.; Sun: 7:30-7:45 a.m. & 10:15-10:30 a.m. (and by appt.)

Baptism - A preparation class is required of the parents requesting Baptism for their first child. Parents and godparents are encouraged to attend the class before the baby's birth. (Scheduled as needed.)

Confirmation - Confirmation is celebrated in the spring with students who are at least in the 8th grade and have completed the requirements for the preparation process in our PRE program.

Matrimony - Couples planning to marry should contact the Pastor at least 5 months prior to the proposed date so all parish and diocesan requirements may be completed.

Holy Orders - If you feel called to a vocation in the priesthood or religious life, please contact the pastor.

Anointing of the Sick - If you wish to receive this sacrament, contact the pastor. If there is an emergency situation, an immediate family member should contact the pastor.

2018-2019 PRE Registration Information

1. The Discount Deadline for the 2018-2019 PRE Registration is 3:00 pm on July 5, 2018. Tuition on or before July 5, 2018 is \$25 for the first child, and \$5 for each remaining child in the family. Tuition after July 5, 2018 is \$30 for the first child, and \$10 for each remaining child in the family.
2. 2018-2019 PRE Registration Deadline is 3:00 pm on July 25, 2018. The only registrations that will be accepted after this deadline will be for newly registered families moving into the area.
3. Classes begin on Sunday, August 5, 2018. ***Note: All PRE classes are held on Sunday morning.**
4. 2018-2019 PRE Registration Packets can be found on the shelves in the foyer under the bulletin board and on the website. **A completed PRE registration form, a Medical Release Form and a Media Permission Form are required EACH year for EACH student** registering for PRE. All three forms are included in the registration packet. ****Note: If your child has received a sacrament (Baptism, 1st Penance, 1st Communion, Confirmation) or has made a Profession of Faith in a Catholic Church other than Holy Angels, please attach a copy of the sacramental certificate to the registration packet.**
5. 1st Penance/1st Communion Registration Packets will be handed out and discussed with the students and their parents at the **MANDATORY** Parent/Student Meeting on Sunday, August 19, 2018 at 9:30 a.m. in the parish hall
6. Confirmation Registration Packets and Service hour information will be handed out and discussed with the 7th and 8th grades students and their parents at the **MANDATORY** Parent/Student Meeting on Sunday, August 26, 2018. The meetings will be held in the 7th & 8th grade classrooms.
7. Also, keep in mind the diocesan requirement that students registering for a sacrament (1st Penance, 1st Communion, Confirmation) must have attended PRE here or somewhere else the prior year in order to register for the sacrament. These students must also provide a copy of the certificate for all sacraments already received.
8. Service Scholarship applications can be found on the PRE bulletin board in the PRE hall at the canopy entrance and on the website.
9. **All PRE registrations packets and sacramental class registration packets are to be turned in to Mr. Pete Hinkel in the parish office.** For your convenience, registration packets/tuition can be dropped off at the parish office, mailed to the parish office or dropped in either of the secure drop boxes provided. (1. On the wall next to the mailbox outside, or 2. On the wall next to Pete Hinkel's office.)

June 3rd — The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ or Corpus Christi Sacrificial blood of the new covenant poured out for us! We do not often think of taking part in these events for our salvation, yet Jesus our messiah takes up the covenant of Moses, and renews and fulfills it for us on his cross. He changes things, once and for all, so here and now, we can take part in his work, opening divine grace and life to the world. The Eucharist draws us into the work of his cross, his life-giving service.

June 8th — Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus On the Friday following The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus. Because this solemnity usually falls in June, this month is also known as the “Month of the Sacred Heart.” Devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus is all about pondering Christ’s love and meditating on Christ’s suffering. The Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus celebrates the love of God as it comes to us from the loving heart of Jesus. The Most Sacred Heart gives us hope; it is a sign that helps us follow Christ, and come at last to our home in him and the Spirit with the Father. No matter how our life unfolds, no matter what other experiences of love we might have, God will surpass these all and be forever for us. In today’s Gospel reading, we hear about the water and blood that flow from the side (the heart) of the crucified Jesus. We draw this water at the fountain of salvation; from the Sacred Heart of the crucified Jesus comes the life-giving water that symbolizes both the water of baptism that cleanses us of sin for our salvation, and the water that only Jesus can offer to quench our thirst for eternal life.

**The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (B) *Corpus Christi*
 June 2/3, 2018**

JUNE – Month of the Sacred Heart

Today we celebrate *Corpus Christi*, the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. In the Eucharist feast, the gifts of bread and wine really and truly become the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Christ. Through his covenant of love, God draws us into his divine life and offers us food for our earthly pilgrimage to continue with the faith and hope, confident in God's ability to transform our weaknesses and sufferings into life and joy.

FIRST READING (Exodus 24:3-8) The people of Moses led out of Egypt had gone through a death to their old way of life and were now on a journey toward the land and life God planned for them. By sprinkling ox blood on them, Moses ritualized their death to the old and their pledge of fidelity to the new covenant of the Law. Their sprinkling, like ours in Baptism, was an outward sign of the indelible inward change that had begun in them.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM (Psalm 116:12-13, 15-16, 17-18) As we say that we will take up the cup of salvation, we join ourselves to the Israelites with Moses and the disciples at the Last Supper. We are invited to consider what the cup of salvation has meant and means for us today. Drinking from this cup brings us into communion with Christ, making up participants in his Passion, Death and Resurrection.

SECOND READING (Hebrews 9:11-15) The Letter to the Hebrews talks about God's dwelling places in the world. Once, the Hebrews carried a tabernacle on pilgrimage with them to the Promised Land and finally installed it in the Temple. The Letter to the Hebrews proclaims that Christ has opened a new tabernacle in the dwelling place of God. In other writings Paul speaks of Christians as new dwelling places for God, as temples of the Holy Spirit. Where do we look for God's dwelling among us?

GOSPEL (Mark 14:12-16, 22-26) In Mark's narrative of the Last Supper, we realize that God has everything prepared, but that it is up to the disciples to lay it all out, to prepare for the

actual sharing around the table. Today, we might put ourselves in their sandals and ask how we are to play our part in preparing for and sharing the meal of the Eucharist. How do we prepare ourselves and what must we do so that others can fully participate?
