Sacraments

Eucharist - Sat Vigil: 5:00 p.m.; Sun: 8:00 a.m. & 10:45 a.m.; Daily Mass: M, W, Th, F at 12 noon; First Saturday ONLY is at 8:00 a.m.; (Holydays - See special announcement in bulletin)

Penance - Sat: 4:30-4:45 p.m.; Sun: 7:30-7:45 a.m. & 10:15-10:30 a.m. (and by appt.)

Baptism - A preparation class is required of the parents requesting Baptism for their first child. Parents and godparents are encouraged to attend the class before the baby's birth. (Scheduled as needed.)

Confirmation - Confirmation is celebrated in the spring with students who are at least in the 8th grade and have completed the requirements for the preparation process in our PRE program.

Matrimony - Couples planning to marry should contact the Pastor at least 5 months prior to the proposed date so all parish and diocesan requirements may be completed.

Holy Orders - If you feel called to a vocation in the priesthood or religious life, please contact the pastor.

Anointing of the Sick - If you wish to receive this sacrament, contact the pastor. If there is an emergency situation, an immediate family member should contact the pastor.

2018-2019 PRE Registration Information

1. The Discount Deadline for the 2018-2019 PRE Registration is 3:00 p.m. on July 5, 2018. Tuition on or before July 5, 2018 is \$25 for the first child, and \$5 for each remaining child in the family. Tuition after July 5, 2018 is \$30 for the first child, and \$10 for each remaining child in the family.
2. 2018-2019 PRE Registration Deadline is 3:00 p.m. on July 25, 2018. The only registrations that will be accepted after this deadline will be for newly registered families moving into the area.
3. **PRE Classes will begin on Sunday, August 5, 2018.**
***Note: All PRE classes are held on Sunday morning.**
4. 2018-2019 PRE Registration Packets can be found on the shelves in the foyer under the bulletin board and on the website. **A completed PRE registration form, a Medical Release Form and a Media Permission Form are required EACH year for EACH student** registering for PRE. All three forms are included in the registration packet. ****Note: If your child has received a sacrament (Baptism, 1st Penance, 1st Communion, and Confirmation) or has made a Profession of Faith in a Catholic Church other than Holy Angels, please attach a copy of the sacramental certificate to the registration packet.**
5. 1st Penance/1st Communion Registration Packets will be handed out and discussed with the students and their parents at the **MANDATORY** Parent/Student Meeting on Sunday, August 19, 2018 at 9:30 a.m. in the parish hall
6. Confirmation Registration Packets and Service hour information will be handed out and discussed with the 7th and 8th grades students and their parents at the **MANDATORY** Parent/Student Meeting on Sunday, August 26, 2018. The meetings will be held in the 7th & 8th grade classrooms.
7. Also, keep in mind the diocesan requirement that students registering for a sacrament (1st Penance, 1st Communion, and Confirmation) must have attended PRE here or somewhere else the prior year in order to register for the sacrament. These students must also provide a copy of the certificate for all sacraments already received.
8. Service Scholarship applications can be found on the PRE bulletin board in the PRE hall at the canopy entrance and on the website.
9. **All PRE registrations packets and sacramental class registration packets are to be turned in to Mr. Pete Hinkel in the parish office.** For your convenience, registration packets/tuition can be dropped off at the parish office, mailed to the parish office or dropped in either of the secure drop boxes provided. (1. On the wall next to the mailbox outside, or 2. On the wall next to Pete Hinkel's office.)

JUNE – Month of the Sacred Heart

The kingdom of God is a great mystery. Like the grain that mysteriously grows, sprouts, and yields fruit, and like the tiny mustard seed, so too the kingdom of God mysteriously grown in magnificence and greatness. Through these images and parables, Jesus helps us understand and enter into the mystery of his kingdom.

FIRST READING (Ezekiel 17:22-24) The image of a majestic tree sheltering all the birds of heaven links today’s First Reading with one of the parables in today’s Gospel. In both cases, the beginnings are small: the tender shoot, the smallest seed. The end result is majestic. In the context of Ezekiel 17, the tender shoot, cultivated by God, is the Davidic monarchy (or, in keeping with the image, David’s family tree). The Lord has power over all the trees of the nations.

This reading, chosen to complement today’s Gospel, is a promise to God’s people. Although they are in exile, God will bring them back and plant them in their own territory. Ezekiel underlines the fact that it is God who will do this, the people can do no more than cooperate with God’s grace.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM (Psalm 92:2-3, 13-14, 15-16) The image of the flourishing tree is found in the second and third stanzas of this Psalm of thanksgiving. Indeed, God’s fidelity to Israel and fulfilment of his promises continues throughout its history.

Praying our psalm, we thank God who is kind and faithful. We remember the promise that God’s faithful will grow like the tallest, best trees known to the people of Israel.

SECOND READING (2 Corinthians 5:6-10) Paul’s words manifest a deep awareness of the ultimate purpose of life: to be at our heavenly home with the Lord. Paul even longs for this. Do we have the same longing?

Ezekiel taught that all growth comes from God. Now Paul says we walk by faith, not by sight. That is one of the hardest things we are called to do. As a people proud of our independence, we would much prefer to make the roadmap for our lives. Nevertheless, our Christian vocation is to discern God’s will, forsaking our own preferences when they impede our Christian journey.

GOSPEL (Mark 4:26-34) The last line of today’s Second Reading speaks of the judgment of the Lord, and this motif is continues in the first parable in today’s Gospel. The overarching emphasis of both parables, however, is that of the mysterious growth of new life, even though we may be unaware of how it comes about. In the parables, the life that comes to be is the kingdom of God. Its humble, almost unnoticeable beginnings result in fruitful harvest, and its abundant foliage gives shelter to all who would dwell in its shade.

Jesus’s seed parables, like the reading from Ezekiel, remind us that the Reign of God is a work of human and divine collaboration. Like the farmer, we must do all we can do to provide the circumstances in which God’s reign can grow. When we do, all is ready for God’s Spirit to breathe life into our world, be it in the garden or the soul of a people.

REFLECTION The readings today speak of trees, seeds and growth. The texts fit perfectly with the summer season. Did you know that these summer months are the hardest of times for food pantries? Children are no longer receiving hot lunches at school and families have a difficult time making ends meet.

Plant an extra row in your garden to share with the local food pantry. Remember those less fortunate and those who produce food in your prayers. And don’t forget your local animal shelter too.
