Sacraments

Eucharist - Sat Vigil: 5:00 p.m.; Sun: 8:00 a.m. & 10:45 a.m.; Daily Mass: M, W, Th, F at 12 noon; First Saturday ONLY is at 8:00 a.m.; (Holydays - See special announcement in bulletin)

Penance - Sat: 4:30-4:45 p.m.; Sun: 7:30-7:45 a.m. & 10:15-10:30 a.m. (and by appt.)

Baptism - A preparation class is required of the parents requesting Baptism for their first child. Parents and godparents are encouraged to attend the class before the baby's birth. (Scheduled as needed.)

Confirmation - Confirmation is celebrated in the spring with students who are at least in the 8th grade and have completed the requirements for the preparation process in our PRE program.

Matrimony - Couples planning to marry should contact the Pastor at least 5 months prior to the proposed date so all parish and diocesan requirements may be completed.

Holy Orders - If you feel called to a vocation in the priesthood or religious life, please contact the pastor.

Anointing of the Sick - If you wish to receive this sacrament, contact the pastor. If there is an emergency situation, an immediate family member should contact the pastor.

2018-2019 PRE Registration Information

1. The Discount Deadline for the 2018-2019 PRE Registration is 3:00 p.m. on July 5, 2018. Tuition on or before July 5, 2018 is \$25 for the first child, and \$5 for each remaining child in the family. Tuition after July 5, 2018 is \$30 for the first child, and \$10 for each remaining child in the family.
2. 2018-2019 PRE Registration Deadline is 3:00 p.m. on July 25, 2018. The only registrations that will be accepted after this deadline will be for newly registered families moving into the area.
3. **PRE Classes will begin on Sunday, August 5, 2018.**
***Note: All PRE classes are held on Sunday morning.**
4. 2018-2019 PRE Registration Packets can be found on the shelves in the foyer under the bulletin board and on the website. **A completed PRE registration form, a Medical Release Form and a Media Permission Form are required EACH year for EACH student** registering for PRE. All three forms are included in the registration packet. ****Note: If your child has received a sacrament (Baptism, 1st Penance, 1st Communion, and Confirmation) or has made a Profession of Faith in a Catholic Church other than Holy Angels, please attach a copy of the sacramental certificate to the registration packet.**
5. 1st Penance/1st Communion Registration Packets will be handed out and discussed with the students and their parents at the **MANDATORY** Parent/Student Meeting on Sunday, August 19, 2018 at 9:30 a.m. in the parish hall
6. Confirmation Registration Packets and Service hour information will be handed out and discussed with the 7th and 8th grades students and their parents at the **MANDATORY** Parent/Student Meeting on Sunday, August 26, 2018. The meetings will be held in the 7th & 8th grade classrooms.
7. Also, keep in mind the diocesan requirement that students registering for a sacrament (1st Penance, 1st Communion, and Confirmation) must have attended PRE here or somewhere else the prior year in order to register for the sacrament. These students must also provide a copy of the certificate for all sacraments already received.
8. Service Scholarship applications can be found on the PRE bulletin board in the PRE hall at the canopy entrance and on the website.
9. **All PRE registrations packets and sacramental class registration packets are to be turned in to Mr. Pete Hinkel in the parish office.** For your convenience, registration packets/tuition can be dropped off at the parish office, mailed to the parish office or dropped in either of the secure drop boxes provided. (1. On the wall next to the mailbox outside, or 2. On the wall next to Pete Hinkel's office.)

Nativity of St. John the Baptist June 23/24, 2018
(12th Sunday in Ordinary Time - B)
JUNE – Month of the Sacred Heart

FIRST READING (Isaiah 49:1-6) In this second of the four “servant of the Lord” oracles in Isaiah, the speaker describes how the Lord called him from the womb, as Jeremiah was called. Language used to describe God’s relationship to Israel is applied to the individual servant who, in this section of Isaiah, can be identified with the people of Israel. Up to this point, God has called and empowered the servant—“hidden” (protected) and given him effective speech. Despite that commission, this “servant” feels that he has labored in vain. In the face of this discouragement, God clarifies his role and identity. “It is too little, he says, for you to be my servant ... I will make you a light to the nations, that my salvation may reach to the ends of the earth.”

RESPONSORIAL PSALM (Psalm 139:1-3b, 13-14ab, 14c-15) One of the most beautiful psalms in the Bible is Psalm 139 which speaks of God’s absolute and sovereignty over our lives. God made us, fashioned us, sees into the depth of our very being and knows every one of our days long before he ever made us. The Psalm is clear that none of us are an accident or a mistake. Each of us is known to God, willed by God, loved by God unconditionally. God knew every good thing we would ever do, before we were made. He also knew every bad, sorrowful and hurtful thing we’d ever do but loves us anyway and made us despite this. A hymned meditation on God’s omnipresence and omniscience. The psalmist is keenly aware of God’s all-knowing gaze, of God’s presence in every part of the universe.

SECOND READING (Acts 13:22-26) This reading is part of one of Paul’s several speeches to Jews in which he proclaims that

the way of Jesus Christ is the logical development of pharisaic Judaism; Jesus, the Savior is the descendant of King David. John the Baptist has a special role in God’s plan of salvation—he ushers in the era of the Messiah, and the promised kingdom is realized within a repentant Israel. John vehemently denies that he is the Messiah; when speaking of his relationship to Jesus, he states that he is not even worthy to be his servant, to “unfasten the sandals of his feet.”

GOSPEL (Luke 1:57-66, 80) The birth of John to Elizabeth is a prelude to the Messiah’s birth; one child announces the presence of another. The boy’s name, John, “the Lord has shown favor,” foreshadows another name, that of Jesus, “the Lord saves.” Elizabeth’s maternity prepares for the maternity of the Mother of God. John’s mission anticipates and inaugurates Jesus’ mission. It is not that the first is characterized by penance and the second by messianic joy. Luke presents a single purpose in two phases, according to God’s plan of salvation—two chapters of the same history. Just as early morning darkness makes way for dawn, the precursor opens the path for the Messiah’s coming. It is necessary for the darkness to diminish so the day may increase.

Ever since the prophecy of the last of the prophets, Malachi,, (some 400 years) the prophets has been speechless. Nine months before the events of this reading, an angel made his announcement to the priest Zechariah in the Temple, and the incredulous man reasoned with the angel, “How shall I know this? For I am an old man, and my wife is advanced in years” (Luke 1:18). The event described in today’s story, around the circumcision and naming of the newborn baby, fascinates the parents and instills the fear of God in the neighborhood—two typical reactions before mystery. Zechariah’s tongue was tied until he wrote the child’s God-given name, “John,” on the tablet. Then his silence was broken.

Some three months before the birth of John, his mother received the visit from her cousin, who had just received the angel’s announcement of the birth of her divine Son. Within Elizabeth’s womb the child danced in front of Mary, the Ark of the Covenant, joyful in the Messiah’s presence.

Today’s solemnity which (in the northern hemisphere) occurs near the longest day of the year, just as the daylight is beginning to diminish, is linked to our celebration on December 24-25. Then, just as daylight is at its shortest span, we celebrate the birth of Jesus, the Light of the world.
