Sacraments

Eucharist - Sat Vigil: 5:00 p.m.; Sun: 8:00 a.m. & 10:45 a.m.; Daily Mass: M, W, Th, F at 12 noon; First Saturday ONLY is at 8:00 a.m.; (Holidays - See special announcement in bulletin)

Penance - Sat: 4:30-4:45 p.m.; Sun: 7:30-7:45 a.m. & 10:15-10:30 a.m. (and by appt.)

Baptism - A preparation class is required of the parents requesting Baptism for their first child. Parents and godparents are encouraged to attend the class before the baby's birth. (Scheduled as needed.)

Confirmation - Confirmation is celebrated in the spring with students who are at least in the 8th grade and have completed the requirements for the preparation process in our PRE program.

Matrimony - Couples planning to marry should contact the Pastor at least 5 months prior to the proposed date so all parish and diocesan requirements may be completed.

Holy Orders - If you feel called to a vocation in the priesthood or religious life, please contact the pastor.

Anointing of the Sick - If you wish to receive this sacrament, contact the pastor. If there is an emergency situation, an immediate family member should contact the pastor.

2018-2019 PRE Registration Information

1. The Discount Deadline for the 2018-2019 PRE Registration is 3:00 p.m. on July 5, 2018. Tuition on or before July 5, 2018 is \$25 for the first child, and \$5 for each remaining child in the family. Tuition after July 5, 2018 is \$30 for the first child, and \$10 for each remaining child in the family.
2. 2018-2019 PRE Registration Deadline is 3:00 p.m. on July 25, 2018. The only registrations that will be accepted after this deadline will be for newly registered families moving into the area.
3. **PRE Classes begin on Sunday, August 5, 2018; 9:30 – 10:30 a.m.**
4. 2018-2019 PRE Registration Packets can be found on the shelves in the foyer under the bulletin board and on the website. **A completed PRE registration form, a Medical Release Form and a Media Permission Form are required EACH year for EACH student** registering for PRE. All three forms are included in the registration packet. ****Note: If your child has received a sacrament (Baptism, 1st Penance, 1st Communion, and Confirmation) or has made a Profession of Faith in a Catholic Church other than Holy Angels, please attach a copy of the sacramental certificate to the registration packet.**
5. 1st Penance/1st Communion Registration Packets will be handed out and discussed with the students and their parents at the **MANDATORY** Parent/Student Meeting on Sunday, August 19, 2018 at 9:30 a.m. in the parish hall
6. Confirmation Registration Packets and Service hour information will be handed out and discussed with the 7th and 8th grades students and their parents at the **MANDATORY** Parent/Student Meeting on Sunday, August 26, 2018. The meetings will be held in the 7th & 8th grade classrooms.
7. Also, keep in mind the diocesan requirement that students registering for a sacrament (1st Penance, 1st Communion, and Confirmation) must have attended PRE here or somewhere else the prior year in order to register for the sacrament. These students must also provide a copy of the certificate for all sacraments already received.
8. Service Scholarship applications can be found on the PRE bulletin board in the PRE hall at the canopy entrance and on the website.
9. **All PRE registrations packets and sacramental class registration packets are to be turned in to Mr. Pete Hinkel in the parish office.** For your convenience, registration packets/tuition can be dropped off at the parish office, mailed to the parish office or dropped in either of the secure drop boxes provided. (1. On the wall next to the mailbox outside, or 2. On the wall next to Pete Hinkel's office.)

JULY – Month of the Most Precious Blood

Today's Gospel recounts the event of the hemorrhaging woman who had found no healing from her affliction even after years and years. Upon hearing about Jesus, she comes to him in faith and courage, and she reaches out to touch him, confident that if she could just touch him, she would be healed. Upon touching Jesus, power rushes out of him, and he heals her of her illness. Jesus praises her faith and tells her to go in peace.

"*Talitha, kum.*" Both the suffering woman and the young girl revive with the healing touch of Jesus. Here, faith in Christ Jesus, Son of God, conquers sickness and death. Today we look to the Church's faith to help us overcome death and sin. Here, God's bride, the Church, looks to the Lord's generosity for

healing and salvation. In the Eucharist, Jesus again asks, "Who touches me?" We do, Lord. Help us! Save us!

FIRST READING (Wisdom 1:13-15; 2:23-24) God creates all human beings for life, for immortality, in his own image. According to the author of Wisdom, death came into the world through the devil, who in envy led the first human creatures away from God and his will for them (Gen 2-3).

This beautiful selection from the Book of Wisdom reminds us that God is the God of Life. Even more wondrous, we are created in God's own image. These are simple ideas well worth contemplating.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM (Psalm 30:2, 4, 5-6, 11, 12, 13) The psalmist celebrates his deliverance from death through God's intervention. In the light of Jesus' Resurrection, we can all make this prayer our own in a preeminent way.

We may not have experienced overwhelming miracles, but each of us has surely experienced God's providence in a time of need. Perhaps it happened when we were at a loss for words and they "came" to us, or we could see no way out, and an alternative appeared unexpectedly. It could well have been a healing at the hands of one of God's servants in the medical field. Whatever the circumstances, it is good for us to remember and give thanks.

SECOND READING (2 Corinthians 8:7, 9, 13-15) Paul encourages the Corinthians to be generous in the collection he is taking for the needs of the Church in Jerusalem. They should look to Jesus as an example of one who gave up his riches in order to supply the needs of others.

Paul is asking the Corinthians to help a community they do not know. Why should they do it? God has been good to them, and the only fitting response is to be good to others.

GOSPEL (Mark 5:21-43 or 5:21-24, 35b-43) Two options are given for today's text. The cure—or rather, raising from the dead—of the synagogue official's daughter forms the frame for the story of the healing of the woman with the hemorrhage in the longer text. The shorter version tells only of the child. The focus in both versions is on the power of Jesus: Jesus the healer, Jesus whose very touch restores life. Indeed, he person of Jesus is the very power of God. He need not touch the hemorrhaging woman; she only needs to touch him. Jesus does what no other human being can. He is the one whom not only the wind and sea obey, but even the realm of sickness and death.

The account of these two miracles provides an action-packed follow-up to the parable of the seed that grows overnight (Mark 4). Both the woman and the girl's father set out to put their faith into action, and thus they opened up the space for God to work wonders for them.
