Sacraments

Eucharist - Sat Vigil: 5:00 p.m.; Sun: 8:00 a.m. & 10:45 a.m.; Daily Mass: M, W, Th, F at 12 noon; First Saturday ONLY is at 8:00 a.m.; (Holidays - See special announcement in bulletin)

Penance - Sat: 4:30-4:45 p.m.; Sun: 7:30-7:45 a.m. & 10:15-10:30 a.m. (and by appt.)

Baptism - A preparation class is required of the parents requesting Baptism for their first child. Parents and godparents are encouraged to attend the class before the baby's birth. (Scheduled as needed.)

Confirmation - Confirmation is celebrated in the spring with students who are at least in the 8th grade and have completed the requirements for the preparation process in our PRE program.

Matrimony - Couples planning to marry should contact the Pastor at least 5 months prior to the proposed date so all parish and diocesan requirements may be completed.

Holy Orders - If you feel called to a vocation in the priesthood or religious life, please contact the pastor.

Anointing of the Sick - If you wish to receive this sacrament, contact the pastor. If there is an emergency situation, an immediate family member should contact the pastor.

2018-2019 PRE Registration Information

1. The Discount Deadline for the 2018-2019 PRE Registration is 3:00 p.m. on July 5, 2018. Tuition on or before July 5, 2018 is \$25 for the first child, and \$5 for each remaining child in the family. Tuition after July 5, 2018 is \$30 for the first child, and \$10 for each remaining child in the family.
2. 2018-2019 PRE Registration Deadline is 3:00 p.m. on July 25, 2018. The only registrations that will be accepted after this deadline will be for newly registered families moving into the area.
3. **PRE Classes begin on Sunday, August 5, 2018; 9:30 – 10:30 a.m.**
4. 2018-2019 PRE Registration Packets can be found on the shelves in the foyer under the bulletin board and on the website. **A completed PRE registration form, a Medical Release Form and a Media Permission Form are required EACH year for EACH student** registering for PRE. All three forms are included in the registration packet. ****Note: If your child has received a sacrament (Baptism, 1st Penance, 1st Communion, and Confirmation) or has made a Profession of Faith in a Catholic Church other than Holy Angels, please attach a copy of the sacramental certificate to the registration packet.**
5. 1st Penance/1st Communion Registration Packets will be handed out and discussed with the students and their parents at the **MANDATORY** Parent/Student Meeting on Sunday, August 19, 2018 at 9:30 a.m. in the parish hall
6. Confirmation Registration Packets and Service hour information will be handed out and discussed with the 7th and 8th grades students and their parents at the **MANDATORY** Parent/Student Meeting on Sunday, August 26, 2018. The meetings will be held in the 7th & 8th grade classrooms.
7. Also, keep in mind the diocesan requirement that students registering for a sacrament (1st Penance, 1st Communion, and Confirmation) must have attended PRE here or somewhere else the prior year in order to register for the sacrament. These students must also provide a copy of the certificate for all sacraments already received.
8. Service Scholarship applications can be found on the PRE bulletin board in the PRE hall at the canopy entrance and on the website.
9. **All PRE registrations packets and sacramental class registration packets are to be turned in to Mr. Pete Hinkel in the parish office.** For your convenience, registration packets/tuition can be dropped off at the parish office, mailed to the parish office or dropped in either of the secure drop boxes provided. (1. On the wall next to the mailbox outside, or 2. On the wall next to Pete Hinkel's office.)

**14th Sunday in Ordinary Time (B) July 7/8, 2018
JULY – Month of the Most Precious Blood**

Sometimes our families are what cause us the most pain and hurt us the most. We see in today's Gospel that even Jesus had difficulty among his own family members, since his own kin took offense and criticized him. The Father has all of his children in his hand and will work miracles among our loved ones as we continue to offer love and prayers for our families, friends, coworkers, and our nations.

FIRST READING (Ezekiel 2:2-5) In today's reading, we hear of God's commissioning of the prophet Ezekiel. (Note the full context of this commissioning, Ex 1:1—3:15). His is a difficult task, for the people to whom he is sent are rebellious, obstinate, and stubborn. The prophet cannot control whether or not the people will receive and accept his work, but he still must speak.

God's communications may sometimes be more realistic than we would hope. Here, Ezekiel is called to be a prophet and warned that he will likely not find success. We might question the value of taking on such a mission. God's answer is simply, "They shall know that a prophet has been among them." No one who has heard a prophet can claim innocence through ignorance.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM (Psalm 123:1-2, 2, 3-4) Mockery and contempt meet prophets of every age whose word is not received. Their only hope is the Lord and his mercy. For this they look longingly.

This is a prayer designed to sustain one like Ezekiel. His heart cannot be set on accomplishment, or else he would soon find another occupation. Fixing our eyes on Christ, especially in a communal context, will show us the way through anything we need to face.

SECOND READING (2 Corinthians 12:7-10) The apostle Paul was the recipient of many special graces and blessings. Nevertheless, even he had his difficulties. His "thorn in the flesh" (2 Cor 12:7) was most probably a human adversary, who was, in fact, driving him crazy! This "thorn" brought out Paul's weaknesses, and Paul begged God that this irritant might be taken away. But the Lord refused. It is here in your powerlessness and need, he tells Paul, that you will meet the fullness of my grace.

Paul is offering us an example of selfless discipleship. He challenges us to accept our weakness as the religious and emotional space where we can best encounter God working in and through us.

GOSPEL (Mark 6:1-6) Jesus' itinerant mission brings him to Nazareth, his home town. Mark casts him in the role of a prophet who is rejected by his own people. Perhaps their familiarity with him and his extended family (his brothers and sisters) blinded them to the Spirit and power of God working within him. The text stresses the importance of openness and faith in Jesus if we wish to receive the gifts of healing he can bestow.

Perhaps the best lesson this Gospel teaches us comes from the "audience." Rather than reassess their way of thinking, they convinced themselves that Jesus, coming from a simple family known to all of them, couldn't possibly have a new message worthy of their attention. Are we ready to hear a divine message from a simple source?
