## Sacraments

Eucharist - Sat Vigil: 5:00 p.m.; Sun: 8:00 a.m. & 10:45 a.m.; Daily Mass: M, W, Th, F at 12 noon; First Saturday ONLY is at 8:00 a.m.; (Holidays - See special announcement in bulletin)

Penance - Sat: 4:30-4:45 p.m.; Sun: 7:30-7:45 a.m. & 10:15-10:30 a.m. (and by appt.)

Baptism - A preparation class is required of the parents requesting Baptism for their first child. Parents and godparents are encouraged to attend the class before the baby's birth. (Scheduled as needed.)

Confirmation - Confirmation is celebrated in the spring with students who are at least in the 8<sup>th</sup> grade and have completed the requirements for the preparation process in our PRE program.

Matrimony - Couples planning to marry should contact the Pastor at least 5 months prior to the proposed date so all parish and diocesan requirements may be completed.

Holy Orders - If you feel called to a vocation in the priesthood or religious life, please contact the pastor.

Anointing of the Sick - If you wish to receive this sacrament, contact the pastor. If there is an emergency situation, an immediate family member should contact the pastor.

### 2018-2019 PRE Registration Information

1. The Discount Deadline for the 2018-2019 PRE Registration is 3:00 p.m. on July 5, 2018. Tuition on or before July 5, 2018 is \$25 for the first child, and \$5 for each remaining child in the family. Tuition after July 5, 2018 is \$30 for the first child, and \$10 for each remaining child in the family.
2. 2018-2019 PRE Registration Deadline is 3:00 p.m. on July 25, 2018. The only registrations that will be accepted after this deadline will be for newly registered families moving into the area.
3. **PRE Classes begin on Sunday, August 5, 2018; 9:30 – 10:30 a.m.**
4. 2018-2019 PRE Registration Packets can be found on the shelves in the foyer under the bulletin board and on the website. **A completed PRE registration form, a Medical Release Form and a Media Permission Form are required EACH year for EACH student** registering for PRE. All three forms are included in the registration packet. **\*\*Note: If your child has received a sacrament (Baptism, 1<sup>st</sup> Penance, 1<sup>st</sup> Communion, and Confirmation) or has made a Profession of Faith in a Catholic Church other than Holy Angels, please attach a copy of the sacramental certificate to the registration packet.**
5. 1<sup>st</sup> Penance/1<sup>st</sup> Communion Registration Packets will be handed out and discussed with the students and their parents at the **MANDATORY** Parent/Student Meeting on Sunday, August 19, 2018 at 9:30 a.m. in the parish hall
6. Confirmation Registration Packets and Service hour information will be handed out and discussed with the 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grades students and their parents at the **MANDATORY** Parent/Student Meeting on Sunday, August 26, 2018. The meetings will be held in the 7<sup>th</sup> & 8<sup>th</sup> grade classrooms.
7. Also, keep in mind the diocesan requirement that students registering for a sacrament (1<sup>st</sup> Penance, 1<sup>st</sup> Communion, and Confirmation) must have attended PRE here or somewhere else the prior year in order to register for the sacrament. These students must also provide a copy of the certificate for all sacraments already received.
8. Service Scholarship applications can be found on the PRE bulletin board in the PRE hall at the canopy entrance and on the website.
9. **All PRE registrations packets and sacramental class registration packets are to be turned in to Mr. Pete Hinkel in the parish office.** For your convenience, registration packets/tuition can be dropped off at the parish office, mailed to the parish office or dropped in either of the secure drop boxes provided. (1. On the wall next to the mailbox outside, or 2. On the wall next to Pete Hinkel's office.)

**Ministry to the Sick** Eucharistic ministers bring the comfort of Christ in the form of the Eucharist to those who cannot come to church; they bring the Church to people. In this way the sick and homebound are united to the Body of Christ present in our community. **15<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time (B) July 14/15, 2018**

**JULY – Month of the Most Precious Blood**

In Ordinary Time, the graces of God’s mystery that we celebrate throughout the liturgical year grow and mature within our hearts. The graces of the birth, life, death, Resurrection, and Ascension of Jesus continue to wash over us through the outpouring of the Holy Spirit as Jesus invites us to ever more deeply follow him and as he sends us out to be his instrument for others in our daily lives.

**FIRST READING** (Amos 7:12-15) The First Reading recounts the call of the prophet Amos, an ordinary man with an

ordinary occupation in his time: a shepherd in Judah. Yet, his life changed radically when he received a call from God to go and speak his word to Israel—a job that won him little popularity among those to whom he was sent, since it was a word of judgment.

When the priest told Amos to stop his prophesying, Amos had a simple response. He told the priest that because it was not he, but God, who had called him to his vocation, no human had the authority to tell him where or how to prophesy.

**RESPONSORIAL PSALM** (Psalm 85:9-10, 11-12, 13-14) Psalm 85 stands in stark contrast to the First Reading. Juxtaposed with Amos’s unwelcome reception stands the psalmist’s stark reminder: salvation is found only in God. We receive God’s kindness and mercy in the person of those who are sent by him.

As we pray this psalm, we are challenged to put our heart and soul into the words we say. Are we ready to ask for the kindness and salvation God offers or do we want to fill out an order for God so that our requests will be answered according to our will?

**SECOND READING** (Ephesians 1:3-14 or 1:3-10) This thanksgiving prayer at the beginning of the letter to the Ephesians calls us to remember the many spiritual blessings we have received in Christ. Perhaps the first step to remembering them is to name them, and Paul gives quite a list. May his words today lead us to realize how truly blessed we are, having been chosen and gifted by God.

Paul is calling us to rejoice in the mystery of our very being. He invites us to contemplate what it means to have been chosen “before the foundation of the world, to be holy.”

**GOSPEL** (Mark 6:7-13) A comparison of Mark’s version of Jesus’ commission of his disciples with that of Matthew’s heard over the last few weekdays quickly demonstrates an important theme in the former Gospel account: Jesus’ power over unclean (demonic) spirits. Lest we be too quick to dismiss these as irrelevant for our lives, we might reflect on how a spirit of evil might be manifested in our own lives. Think of the biblical image of “pure of heart” (Matt 5:8, Ps 15:2). Do we realize that the presence of God’s spirit within us has power over those things that are not of God? Jesus “summoned the Twelve.” They did not choose him, but he them, and he sent them. Likewise, we who are baptized have been summoned to continue Jesus’s mission in the world. This is a moment to ask what gifts God has given us for the good of others.
