## Sacraments

**Penance** - Sat: 4:30-4:45 p.m.; Sun: 7:30-7:45 a.m. & 10:15-10:30 a.m. (and by appt.)

**Baptism** - A preparation class is required of the parents requesting Baptism for their first child. Parents and godparents are encouraged to attend the class before the baby's birth. (Scheduled as needed.)

**Confirmation** - Confirmation is celebrated in the spring with students who are at least in the 8<sup>th</sup> grade and have completed the requirements for the preparation process in our PRE program.

**Matrimony** - Couples planning to marry should contact the Pastor at least 5 months prior to the proposed date so all parish and diocesan requirements may be completed.

**Holy Orders** - If you feel called to a vocation in the priesthood or religious life, please contact the pastor.

**Anointing of the Sick** - If you wish to receive this sacrament, contact the pastor. If there is an emergency situation, an immediate family member should contact the pastor.

### 2018-2019 PRE Registration Information

1. The Discount Deadline for the 2018-2019 PRE Registration is 3:00 p.m. on July 5, 2018. Tuition on or before July 5, 2018 is \$25 for the first child, and \$5 for each remaining child in the family. Tuition after July 5, 2018 is \$30 for the first child, and \$10 for each remaining child in the family.
2. 2018-2019 PRE Registration Deadline is 3:00 p.m. on July 25, 2018. The only registrations that will be accepted after this deadline will be for newly registered families moving into the area.
3. **PRE Classes begin on Sunday, August 5, 2018; 9:30 – 10:30 a.m.**
4. 2018-2019 PRE Registration Packets can be found on the shelves in the foyer under the bulletin board and on the website. **A completed PRE registration form, a Medical Release Form and a Media Permission Form are required EACH year for EACH student** registering for PRE. All three forms are included in the registration packet. **\*\*Note: If your child has received a sacrament (Baptism, 1<sup>st</sup> Penance, 1<sup>st</sup> Communion, and Confirmation) or has made a Profession of Faith in a Catholic Church other than Holy Angels, please attach a copy of the sacramental certificate to the registration packet.**
5. 1<sup>st</sup> Penance/1<sup>st</sup> Communion Registration Packets will be handed out and discussed with the students and their parents at the **MANDATORY** Parent/Student Meeting on Sunday, August 19, 2018 at 9:30 a.m. in the parish hall
6. Confirmation Registration Packets and Service hour information will be handed out and discussed with the 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grades students and their parents at the **MANDATORY** Parent/Student Meeting on Sunday, August 26, 2018. The meetings will be held in the 7<sup>th</sup> & 8<sup>th</sup> grade classrooms.
7. Also, keep in mind the diocesan requirement that students registering for a sacrament (1<sup>st</sup> Penance, 1<sup>st</sup> Communion, and Confirmation) must have attended PRE here or somewhere else the prior year in order to register for the sacrament. These students must also provide a copy of the certificate for all sacraments already received.
8. Service Scholarship applications can be found on the PRE bulletin board in the PRE hall at the canopy entrance and on the website.
9. **All PRE registrations packets and sacramental class registration packets are to be turned in to Mr. Pete Hinkel in the parish office.** For your convenience, registration packets/tuition can be dropped off at the parish office, mailed to the parish office or dropped in either of the secure drop boxes provided. (1. On the wall next to the mailbox outside, or 2. On the wall next to Pete Hinkel's office.)

Are you a baptized Catholic, but never received the sacraments of Confirmation or Eucharist?

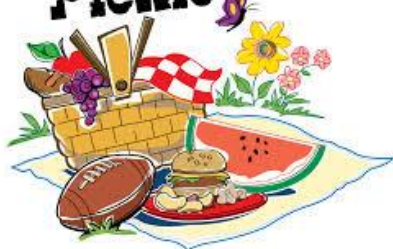
Are you interested in learning more about the Catholic Faith?

**16<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time (B) July 21/22, 2018  
JULY – Month of the Most Precious Blood**

In today’s Gospel, we see the compassion and reasonableness of Jesus, who cares for our human needs. After the apostles work hard, Jesus invites them to come away to a deserted place to rest. These summer months can likewise provide opportunity for rest and vacation, in which we come away from our daily duties in

order to draw closer to God through prayer and treasured time spent with our family and friends.

**FIRST READING** (Jeremiah 23:1-6) In the Old Testament, kings are often referred to as the shepherds of their people, an image perhaps associated with King David, who was a shepherd before he became king. In today’s reading from Jeremiah, Israel’s kings have failed in their responsibilities for the welfare of their people. Nevertheless, there is hope in God’s promise to raise up an heir to David who will shepherd the people wisely.

The religious leaders of Jeremiah’s day left much to be desired. The assurance we find in this reading is that God will find a way to care for us, even when those appointed do not live up to their calling. If we hope for leadership that cares for those in greatest need, we must also be prepared to do our part.

**RESPONSORIAL PSALM** (Psalm 23:1-3, 3-4, 5, 6) The image of shepherding continues, focusing not on earthly rulers but on the Lord. Psalm 23 is much loved, since its words bring comfort and peace. With the Lord, we lack nothing.

This most well-known psalm reminds us that God is ever watching over us. It does not promise a life of ease, but rather that God will be there with us through the dark valleys.

**SECOND READING** (Ephesians 2:13-18) Although the Second Reading normally has no relation to the First Reading and the Gospel, the first line of today’s reading, with its reference to those who were “far off” (Eph 2:13), evokes the state of a formerly scattered people, now united through the reconciling work of Christ.

Paul tells us that Christ is our peace. The work of Christ was to bring together all of us who were far off and far apart. Therefore, when we offer or seek the peace of Christ, we are committing ourselves to do our part to bring about the unity that all of humanity was created to enjoy.

**GOSEL** (Mark 6:30-34) While it is the fourth Gospel that specifically names Jesus as the Good Shepherd (John 10), he is depicted in that role at the end of today’s Gospel. The people’s special need would seem to be guidance and teaching, for Jesus responds to them by doing so. In subsequent verses, not included in today’s Gospel, he feeds them with bread and fish.

Here we see Jesus’s solicitude for his disciples and the crowds. Like the disciples, we need to know that there is a time for rest as well as a time to respond to the needs of others. Pastors understand that there are times when the needs of the sheep prevail.
