Sacraments

Penance - Sat: 4:30-4:45 p.m.; Sun: 7:30-7:45 a.m. & 10:15-10:30 a.m. (and by appt.)

Baptism - A preparation class is required of the parents requesting Baptism for their first child. Parents and godparents are encouraged to attend the class before the baby's birth. (Scheduled as needed.)

Confirmation - Confirmation is celebrated in the spring with students who are at least in the 8th grade and have completed the requirements for the preparation process in our PRE program.

Matrimony - Couples planning to marry should contact the Pastor at least 5 months prior to the proposed date so all parish and diocesan requirements may be completed.

Holy Orders - If you feel called to a vocation in the priesthood or religious life, please contact the pastor.

Anointing of the Sick - If you wish to receive this sacrament, contact the pastor. If there is an emergency situation, an immediate family member should contact the pastor.

PLEASE NOTE CHANGES MADE TO THE 2018-2019 PRE CALENDAR

2018-2019 PRE Registration Information

1. The Discount Deadline for the 2018-2019 PRE Registration is 3:00 p.m. on July 5, 2018. Tuition on or before July 5, 2018 is \$25 for the first child, and \$5 for each remaining child in the family. Tuition after July 5, 2018 is \$30 for the first child, and \$10 for each remaining child in the family.
2. 2018-2019 PRE Registration Deadline is 3:00 p.m. on July 25, 2018. The only registrations that will be accepted after this deadline will be for newly registered families moving into the area.
3. **PRE Classes begin on Sunday, August 5, 2018; 9:30 – 10:30 a.m.**
4. 2018-2019 PRE Registration Packets can be found on the shelves in the foyer under the bulletin board and on the website. **A completed PRE registration form, a Medical Release Form and a Media Permission Form are required EACH year for EACH student** registering for PRE. All three forms are included in the registration packet. ****Note: If your child has received a sacrament (Baptism, 1st Penance, 1st Communion, and Confirmation) or has made a Profession of Faith in a Catholic Church other than Holy Angels, please attach a copy of the sacramental certificate to the registration packet.**
5. 1st Penance/1st Communion Registration Packets will be handed out and discussed with the students and their parents at the **MANDATORY** Parent/Student Meeting on Sunday, August 19, 2018 at 9:30 a.m. in the parish hall
6. Confirmation Registration Packets and Service hour information will be handed out and discussed with the 7th and 8th grades students and their parents at the **MANDATORY** Parent/Student Meeting on Sunday, August 26, 2018. The meetings will be held in the 7th & 8th grade classrooms.
7. Also, keep in mind the diocesan requirement that students registering for a sacrament (1st Penance, 1st Communion, and Confirmation) must have attended PRE here or somewhere else the prior year in order to register for the sacrament. These students must also provide a copy of the certificate for all sacraments already received.
8. Service Scholarship applications can be found on the PRE bulletin board in the PRE hall at the canopy entrance and on the website.
9. **All PRE registrations packets and sacramental class registration packets are to be turned in to Mr. Pete Hinkel in the parish office.** For your convenience, registration packets/tuition can be dropped off at the parish office, mailed to the parish office or dropped in either of the secure drop boxes provided. (1. On the wall next to the mailbox outside, or 2. On the wall next to Pete Hinkel's office.)

17th Sunday in Ordinary Time (B) July 28/29, 2018

JULY – Month of the Most Precious Blood

God always provides. He always gives us what we need and brings abundance out of what seems to not be enough, at least to us. In today's Gospel, Philip states the fact that two hundred days' wages would not be enough to feed the crowd of five thousand. However, with Jesus, our almighty God, human limitations cease to be limitations. God uses the little we have, and he performs miracles to feed and nourish all of us in abundance.

FIRST READING (2 Kings 4:42-44) Elisha, prophetic successor to Elijah, miraculously feeds his people in a time of famine. Notice Elisha's firm conviction that God would amply provide for the people with the meager provisions at hand. Ample, indeed! After they had eaten, there was some left over.

This incident takes place during a time of famine. When Elisha receives a gift of bread, he immediately gives it to a large crowd. Given the option of hoarding or solidarity, he shoes us hoe to choose that which promises greater life.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM (Psalm 145:10-11, 15-16, 17-18) Psalm 145 invites the gratitude that God's people should have in face of his providential care. The entire second stanza focuses

on how God nourishes his people with food—most fitting in light of today's First Reading. The last stanza reminds us that we have only to call on God and he will hear us.

As we pray "The hand of the Lord feeds us," we need to be aware of how our own hands are often the ones God would use to help others.

SECOND READING (Ephesians 4:1-6) Paul speaks directly to the nature of the Christian vocation, spelling out for his readers not only what it is to which they are called, but also, and perhaps most importantly here, how they are to live in a "worthy" manner. The emphasis is on unity, with one occurring seven times in the space of six verses, not counting the synonymous word unity. Believers have a choice as to how they respond to others.

"Live in a manner worthy of the call you have received." That might be the one command necessary for a Christian life. It reminds us that we are called by God and that, day by day, we must choose whether or not to accept the grace we are offered for the good of the whole.

GOSPEL (John 6:1-15) Today's Gospel describes Jesus as Prophet—a title or description not commonly thought of, perhaps. He is one who speaks and acts in the name of God, as the sign of the miraculous feeding of the multitude attests. Several parallels can be found with the First Reading: the barley loaves, the objection by one of the followers, the abundance left over. Note the Eucharistic language: Jesus "took," "gave thanks," and "distributed" (John 6:11). Do we recognize our own Eucharistic celebrations as occasions of being fed by Jesus?

The "sign" of the bread includes great generosity and trust. The shelf-sacrificing generosity of the child who offered all his food prepared the way for everyone to share, not keeping or taking more than needed and offering the rest to the others. Today's readings remind us that God's generosity is often expressed through human hands.

REFLECTION There is an old expression, "If you want to get something done, ask a busy person." Busy people and generous people often go hand in hand. The miracle of the loaves and fishes is about people sharing what they have and there being plenty left over. What are the needs of your parish? Do we need more ministers in specific areas? Have you asked clearly and honestly for what you need? God will provide—a few brave souls will come forward and pave the way. People tend to be extremely generous with their time and talent if they know what the needs are—communication is key.
