## Sacraments

**Penance** - Sat: 4:30-4:45 p.m.; Sun: 7:30-7:45 a.m. & 10:15-10:30 a.m. (and by appt.)

**Baptism** - A preparation class is required of the parents requesting Baptism for their first child. Parents and godparents are encouraged to attend the class before the baby's birth. (Scheduled as needed.)

**Confirmation** - Confirmation is celebrated in the spring with students who are at least in the 8<sup>th</sup> grade and have completed the requirements for the preparation process in our PRE program.

**Matrimony** - Couples planning to marry should contact the Pastor at least 5 months prior to the proposed date so all parish and diocesan requirements may be completed.

**Holy Orders** - If you feel called to a vocation in the priesthood or religious life, please contact the pastor.

**Anointing of the Sick** - If you wish to receive this sacrament, contact the pastor. If there is an emergency situation, an immediate family member should contact the pastor.

**AUGUST – MONTH OF THE IMMACULATE HEART OF MARY** The month of August is dedicated to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. The memorial of the Immaculate Heart of Mary takes place on the day after the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, usually in June, but in this month when we celebrate Mary’s Assumption (August 15) and her Coronation or Queenship (August 22), we also give honor to her Immaculate Heart. There are many prayers to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. Here is one short enough to memorize and pray every day during this special month: “O Immaculate Heart of the Blessed Virgin Mary, obtain for me from Jesus a pure and humble heart.”

# PRE INFORMATION

## 2018-2019 PRE Registration Information

1. The Discount Deadline for the 2018-2019 PRE Registration is 3:00 p.m. on July 5, 2018. Tuition on or before July 5, 2018 is \$25 for the first child, and \$5 for each remaining child in the family. Tuition after July 5, 2018 is \$30 for the first child, and \$10 for each remaining child in the family.
2. 2018-2019 PRE Registration Deadline is 3:00 p.m. on July 25, 2018. The only registrations that will be accepted after this deadline will be for newly registered families moving into the area.
3. **PRE Classes begin on Sunday, August 5, 2018; 9:30 – 10:30 a.m.**
4. 2018-2019 PRE Registration Packets can be found on the shelves in the foyer under the bulletin board and on the website. **A completed PRE registration form, a Medical Release Form and a Media Permission Form are required EACH year for EACH student** registering for PRE. All three forms are included in the registration packet. **\*\*Note: If your child has received a sacrament (Baptism, 1<sup>st</sup> Penance, 1<sup>st</sup> Communion, and Confirmation) or has made a Profession of Faith in a Catholic Church other than Holy Angels, please attach a copy of the sacramental certificate to the registration packet.**
5. 1<sup>st</sup> Penance/1<sup>st</sup> Communion Registration Packets will be handed out and discussed with the students and their parents at the **MANDATORY** Parent/Student Meeting on Sunday, August 19, 2018 at 9:30 a.m. in the parish hall
6. Confirmation Registration Packets and Service hour information will be handed out and discussed with the 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grades students and their parents at the **MANDATORY** Parent/Student Meeting on Sunday, August 26, 2018. The meetings will be held in the 7<sup>th</sup> & 8<sup>th</sup> grade classrooms.
7. Also, keep in mind the diocesan requirement that students registering for a sacrament (1<sup>st</sup> Penance, 1<sup>st</sup> Communion, and Confirmation) must have attended PRE here or somewhere else the prior year in order to register for the sacrament. These students must also provide a copy of the certificate for all sacraments already received.
8. Service Scholarship applications can be found on the PRE bulletin board in the PRE hall at the canopy entrance and on the website.
9. **All PRE registrations packets and sacramental class registration packets are to be turned in to Mr. Pete Hinkel in the parish office.** For your convenience, registration packets/tuition can be dropped off at the parish office, mailed to the parish office or dropped in either of the secure drop boxes provided. (1. On the wall next to the mailbox outside, or 2. On the wall next to Pete Hinkel's office.)

**The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary**

**Wednesday, August 15<sup>th</sup>**

**Masses will be at 12 noon and 6:00pm.**

The dogma of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary was proclaimed in 1950, but this observance has been celebrated on this day from the middle of the fifth century. On this solemnity, we profess our belief that Mary has gone before us, body and soul, into heaven. For her, the resurrection of the dead has taken place already. And thus the Assumption is an Easter feast. As Pope Benedict XVI said in his homily on the day in 2008, “The Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the oldest Marian Feast, returns every year in the heart of summer. It is an opportunity to rise with Mary to the heights of the spirit where one breathes the pure air of supernatural life and contemplates the most authentic beauty, the beauty of holiness. The atmosphere of today’s celebration is steeped in paschal joy.”

This day we celebrate the promise of God expressed fully in the life of Mary, the Holy Mother of God. God invites us to eternal life, to enjoy the glorious new creation of his Son in body, soul and spirit. Our final hope is the resurrection of our own bodies at the end of time to exist forever in this new order of creation. The Solemnity of the Assumption is our great celebration of this final hope. Mary is a pioneer for us in faith. She was the first among us to accept Jesus Christ into her life. In her bodily Assumption, she is also the first to fully enjoy eternal life at the side of her Risen Son in the glory of heaven. Where she has gone, we hope to follow. We rejoice in the fulfillment of God’s promise in her, as we turn to her to guide us to the side of her Risen Son who reigns in heaven.

Mary’s Song, the Magnificat, would be a good prayer to carry in our pocket, purse, or briefcase. It is a statement of faith for when we want to rejoice or need to rely on God. It is a proclamation of trust when we need to call upon God. Pray it in a time of illness, betrayal, or anxiety. Whether we are strong or weak, we can walk with Mary in the footsteps of our ancestors of faith, relying on the Lord.

Happy is she who bore the Son of God. Still happier are those who hear God’s word and keep it! Today’s solemnity is for all of us, because Mary has accomplished what the Church hopes and expects to have happen to us, too. As Jesus was born of sinless Mary, so we are born anew, sinless from the womb of the Church in baptism. The Lord God’s promise to us will be fulfilled. For this, we too can justly proclaim the greatness of the Lord who has looked upon his lowly servants and raised them up!

**18<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time (B) Aug 4/5, 2018**

**AUGUST – Month of the Immaculate Heart of Mary**

In today’s Gospel, Jesus entreats us not to work for bread that perishes, but rather to work for the bread that endures for eternal life. Of course, it is necessary and important for us to work well here on earth for our human needs; however, all our material goods are means to serve the higher good of our union with God. Today, Jesus teaches us that he is the true bread of life truly present in the Eucharist whom we encounter at every Mass.

**FIRST READING** (Exodus 16:2-4, 12-15) The selection of Exodus’ account of the manna in the desert is most appropriate, given the reference to this event in today’s Gospel. How soon into their desert journey does Israel forget the miraculous crossing of the sea (Exodus 14—15) and begin complaining—or “murmuring,” as the scripture names it. First, it is about the lack of water (Exodus 15:22-27), and shortly after that, it is about bread and meat (today’s text). How faithful and merciful is our God not only in putting up with their complaints, but in continually supplying their needs.

God provided bread for the complaining people, but they didn’t know what it was. Happily, Moses could tell them. How

often does God answer our prayers or meet our needs and we fail to recognize the gift being offered? Who has helped us see a gift in what at first appeared to us to be strange?

**RESPONSORIAL PSALM** (Psalm 78:3-4, 23-24, 25, 54) Psalm 78 is one of the Psalms that recounts Israel’s history and the portion chosen for day, fittingly, is about the provision of manna, a sweet substance secreted by insects on a certain kind of tree, common in the desert areas of Sinai. For the hungry Israelite desert wanderers, it was bread from heaven!

The psalm sings of what the elders experienced and retold to their descendants over and again. While we may personally thank God for many things, do we tell our stories of blessings? Many times we tell of the hardest things in our lives, but how often do we give witness to God’s providence? Celebrating God’s blessings is a form of evangelization and a path to better recognizing God’s action in our lives.

**SECOND READING** (Ephesians 4:17, 20-24) Continuing our readings from Ephesians, today’s text is an emphatic reminder that the Christian lifestyle must be noticeably different from that of those who do not profess to believe in him. Is ours?

Note that Paul says: “You learned Christ,” not “You learned about Christ.” The knowledge Paul is talking about here is comparable to the difference between knowing what a bicycle is and knowing how to ride one. To learn Christ means to let Christ so influence our heart and mind that others will know Christ by watching us. That demands a lot of practice!

**GOSPEL** (John 6:24-35) Having met the people’s physical need for food, Jesus brings them to a new level of understanding. There is a difference between food to nourish the body and the spiritual food of eternal life. The latter is what they should hunger for even more. This spiritual food that Jesus offers is the true bread from heaven, the bread that gives eternal life.

The message from John’s account of the Gospel complements what Paul said. Jesus, who said “my food is to do the will of the One who sent me,” (John 4:34) say that he himself can be our sustenance. Christ, in his message and in his living Body, is the heavenly bread God continues to send to us.

**REFLECTION** In his *Rule*, Benedict warns the monks five times against the sin of “murmuring.” He suggests monks should be grateful to have what they need and not to compare wants with what others have. Sadly, it seems to be our human nature to murmur. Anytime you make a change, the first thing you will hear is “We’ve always done it this way.” It’s human nature—people complain. It is easy to start gossiping while venting or if someone has unreal expectations. As our Gospel reminds us, “What can we do to accomplish the works of God?” Jesus answered and said to them, “This is the work of God that you believe in the one he sent.”
