Sacraments

Penance - Sat: 4:30-4:45 p.m.; Sun: 7:30-7:45 a.m. & 10:15-10:30 a.m. (and by appt.)

Baptism - A preparation class is required of the parents requesting Baptism for their first child. Parents and godparents are encouraged to attend the class before the baby's birth. (Scheduled as needed.)

Confirmation - Confirmation is celebrated in the spring with students who are at least in the 8th grade and have completed the requirements for the preparation process in our PRE program.

Matrimony - Couples planning to marry should contact the Pastor at least 5 months prior to the proposed date so all parish and diocesan requirements may be completed.

Holy Orders - If you feel called to a vocation in the priesthood or religious life, please contact the pastor.

Anointing of the Sick - If you wish to receive this sacrament, contact the pastor. If there is an emergency situation, an immediate family member should contact the pastor.

Aug 19th — MANDATORY 1st Penance Parents' Meeting The 1st Penance Registration/Information Meeting is Sunday, August 19th at 9:30 a.m. in the Parish Hall. Sacramental Registration Forms and information will be distributed at this meeting. It is MANDATORY that each 1st Penance student and at least one of his/her parents attend this preparation meeting if you wish to register your child for 1st Penance. Attendance will be taken. Regular PRE class will resume after the meeting.

Aug 26th — MANDATORY Confirmation Parents' Meeting The 7th & 8th Grade Service Hour and Confirmation Meeting is Sunday, August 26th at 9:30 a.m. in the classrooms located in the basement. Sacramental Registration Forms, Confirmation information and service hour information will be distributed at this meeting. It is MANDATORY that each 7th and 8th grade students and at least one of his/her parents attend this preparation meeting if you wish to register your child for Confirmation. Attendance will be taken. Regular PRE class will resume after the meeting.

Also, keep in mind the diocesan requirement that students registering for a sacrament (1st Penance, 1st Communion, and Confirmation) must have attended PRE here or somewhere else the prior year in order to register for the sacrament. These students must also provide a copy of the certificate for all sacraments already received.

All sacramental class registration packets are to be turned in to Pete Hinkel in the parish office. For your convenience, sacramental registration packets can be dropped off at the parish office, mailed to the parish office or dropped in either of the secure drop boxes provided: on the wall next to the mailbox outside, or on the wall next to Pete Hinkel's office.

19th Sunday in Ordinary Time (B) Aug 11/12, 2018

AUGUST – Month of the Immaculate Heart of Mary

In today's Gospel, Jesus gives us the secret of union God. He teaches that everyone who listens to the Father and learns from him will come to him. By listening to the Father through prayerful stillness and the experiences of his goodness within our lives, we shall all be taught by God. Furthermore, through the gift of the Holy Eucharist, Jesus teaches us and brings us into physical and sacramental union with the Father and the Spirit.

FIRST READING (1 Kings 19:4-8) The context of today's reading is Elijah's desperate flight to preserve his life after the slaughter of the false prophets of Baal (1 Kings 18:40). Aware that Queen Jezebel sought to kill him in revenge, Elijah begs God to take his life. God, however, has a much longer journey in mind for Elijah—one to Horeb (Sinai), the mountain of God. There Elijah will experience God's presence (1 Kings 19:9-18). Of particular significance in light of today's Gospel is the fact that God not only entrusts Elijah with a mission, but provides food for the journey.

Mother Theresa is said to have remarked that God would never give her more than she could handle. But she added, "I only wish he didn't trust me so much!" When Elijah felt like that, ready to lie down and die, God sent an angel to wake him up and give him food to strengthen him. This might remind us

of the warning "My child, when you come to serve the Lord, / prepare yourself for trials" (Sirach 2:1). The only consolation, known by all who serve until the end, is that God will be with us.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM (Psalm 34:2-3, 4-5, 6-7, 8-9) "Taste" (antiphon) the food that the Lord provides, today's Psalm invites. This Psalm of praise acclaims the marvels of God's deliverance from distress. The psalmist "tasted" (experienced) God's goodness in his own life experience. Do we?

What a change of mood, from the ordeal of serving God to "Let my soul glory in the Lord." Saints and holy people across the ages seem to agree: to the extent that we recognize and accept our own incapacity, we recognize and experience God working through us. That is not to deny our abilities, but rather to offer all that we are and are not so that God can work in and through us.

SECOND READING (Ephesians 4:30—5:2) Ephesians' call to "be imitators of God" (Eph 5:1)—in the context of today's scriptures—invites us to reflect on how we nourish one another. The "goodness" (Responsorial Psalm antiphon) we are to show to one another is aptly described. Do we give ourselves as a "sacrificial offering" (Eph 5:2)—as food for one another?

How often have we considered the effects of our Baptism? Paul wants us to understand that Baptism has a profound effect on us. As baptized, we have become Christ's own so profoundly that Christ's Spirit lives in us, luring us toward all that we can become through sharing life with Christ. We cannot control the Spirit, but we are free to choose how much we wish to be open to God's constant offer of grace.

GOSPEL (John 6:41-51) What a beautiful image—to be drawn by the Father to Jesus. The Greek verb used here actually has the sense of a magnetic pull or attraction. Do we yield ourselves to its force or resist? With Jesus, we make our way to our heavenly home and to eternal life. Lest the journey be too much for us, we are nourished with the bread of life, Jesus' sacrificial offering of himself.

Throughout John's Gospel we encounter superficial understandings of Jesus's teaching. The people hearing Jesus in today's story held such a high opinion of their knowledge of Jesus's background that they blinded themselves to him and his message. They who refused to accept the living bread stand as a warning to us about the devastating effects of low expectations.
