## Sacraments

**Penance** - Sat: 4:30-4:45 p.m.; Sun: 7:30-7:45 a.m. & 10:15-10:30 a.m. (and by appt.)

**Baptism** - A preparation class is required of the parents requesting Baptism for their first child. Parents and godparents are encouraged to attend the class before the baby's birth. (Scheduled as needed.)

**Confirmation** - Confirmation is celebrated in the spring with students who are at least in the 8<sup>th</sup> grade and have completed the requirements for the preparation process in our PRE program.

**Matrimony** - Couples planning to marry should contact the Pastor at least 5 months prior to the proposed date so all parish and diocesan requirements may be completed.

**Holy Orders** - If you feel called to a vocation in the priesthood or religious life, please contact the pastor.

**Anointing of the Sick** - If you wish to receive this sacrament, contact the pastor. If there is an emergency situation, an immediate family member should contact the pastor.

Attendance will be taken. Regular PRE class will resume after the meeting.

**20<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time (B) Aug 19/20, 2018**

**AUGUST – Month of the Immaculate Heart of Mary**

At Mass, we receive eternal life as we consume the living bread  
of Christ's Body and Blood in the Eucharist. This is the purpose  
of why we come to church every Sunday; to gather together as  
God's people, to remember and ratify God's covenant of love  
and life for us, and to receive his life within us as we are  
nourished by the gift of his own Body and Blood. Today and  
each Sunday we celebrate this mystery, which has been handed  
down from Christ through the ages until today. Within the Mass  
and the life of the Church, our Catholic faith celebrates and lives  
Christ yesterday, today, and always.

**FIRST READING** (Proverbs 9:1-6) Both the Hebrew and the  
Greek words for *wisdom* are feminine in gender, thus giving rise  
to descriptions of this personification of an attribute of God as a  
woman. Today, Proverbs speaks of her as preparing a lavish  
banquet of the food of understanding and inviting all to partake.

The early Christian tradition saw Wisdom as a figure of the  
Holy Spirit. Here, Wisdom invites the simple to come and enjoy  
all she has to offer. We might ask ourselves whether we can be  
counted as the simple who savor the banquet or if we are more  
like the self-proclaimed wise who are invited to forsake  
foolishness.

**RESPONSORIAL PSALM** (Psalm 34:2-3, 4-5, 6-7) The  
invitation to taste of the banquet provided by the Lord is echoed  
in today's Responsorial Psalm—a Psalm of praise.

This is the favorite psalm to accompany Jesus's Bread of Life  
discourse. Its repetition invites us to deepen our appreciation of  
what it proclaims. This week it underlines Wisdom's invitation  
to the feast. The third stanza is an offer well worth serious  
meditation. Let us ask ourselves how willing we are to seek  
deeper encounters with the God of life.

**SECOND READING** (Ephesians 5:15-20) Do we think of  
our everyday life as an "opportunity" (Eph 5:16) provided by  
the Lord? The author of Ephesians did, and instructs his  
community accordingly. What wisdom is to be found in his  
words!

The message keeps being repeated. Paul calls us to act, not  
like fools, but to discern the will of the Lord. For him, being a  
fool means to follow our own will, disregarding the search for  
what God has in mind for us. He advises us to replace  
overindulgence in food and drink with being filled with the  
Spirit. Of course, we cannot control the gifts of the Spirit, but  
we can either seek them or allow the pursuit of other things to  
detour us from the road of Wisdom.

**GOSPEL** (John 6:51-58) As we continue our reading of the  
Bread of Life discourse, we hear Jesus speak of himself as the  
"living bread" (John 6:51)—true manna from heaven—the food  
that nourishes unto eternal life. The identification of the bread  
with his own flesh and blood is startling for many of his hearers.  
And what about those who hear today? Do we really hear it?  
Do we recognize what—who—is offered to us in each  
Eucharist?

This is one of the most direct statements Jesus makes about  
himself in the Gospel. He says that the path to life—real life, a  
holy life, a fulfilled life—passes through him. Being with and in  
him is so essential that he refers to it as the basic nourishment  
we need for life. There may be many paths toward God, but  
none of them compare to what he says he offers. We who hear  
Jesus's words are faced with a choice to pursue or reject a life of  
communion with and in Christ.

**REFLECTION** The images from the Proverbs reading show  
us a God whose name is Wisdom, who is unbelievably generous.  
An interesting conversation around the Sunday dinner table  
might be about Wisdom's invitation to those who are simple to  
come to her house. Being simple has a fairly negative  
connotation in our culture. What is the Scripture trying to tell  
us?
