THE HIGHEST LAW

From time to time, newspapers and magazines will offer, as an item of "filler," various laws that are still on the books but seem silly to us in our day and age. In one California city, it is illegal to have two indoor bathtubs in one house. Clean water, a precious commodity when the law was written, is now readily available, so the law seems silly. But the human value of protecting and preserving precious resources is still around, evident in many conservation laws that seem sensible to us. So it is with the laws of religious tradition. What Jesus scorns today is others' attitude toward ritual laws, an attitude that becomes nearly idolatrous when laws are observed for their own sake. Jesus teaches that observation of external ritual laws is of value only when they are emblems of our internal disposition toward the will of God. Our whole lives must follow the one ultimate law of God: to love God completely and to love neighbor entirely. Roman Catholicism is a tradition rich with customs, traditions, and even laws. As we continue to listen to the voice of Christ, we must always look into our own hearts and underneath our ritual practices to make sure that love of God and love of neighbor are what we prize above all.

Desde el escritorio del Padre Juan Antonio

Estimados Parroquianos,

Exortación Apostólica Amoris Laetitia

Dicho esto, se comprende que la desocupación y la precariedad laboral se transformen en sufrimiento, como se hace notar en el librito de Rut y como recuerda Jesús en la parábola de los trabajadores sentados, en un ocio forzado, en la plaza del pueblo (cf. Mt 20,1-16), o cómo él lo experimenta en el mismo hecho de estar muchas veces rodeado de menesterosos y hambrientos. Es lo que la sociedad está viviendo trágicamente en muchos países, y esta ausencia de fuentes de trabajo afecta de diferentes maneras a la serenidad de las familias.

Tampoco podemos olvidar la degeneración que el pecado introduce en la sociedad cuando el ser humano se comporta como tirano ante la naturaleza, devastándola, usándola de modo egoísta y hasta brutal. Las consecuencias son al mismo tiempo la desertificación del suelo (cf. Gn 3,17-19) y los desequilibrios económicos y sociales, contra los cuales se levanta con claridad la voz de los profetas, desde Elías (cf. 1 R 21) hasta llegar a las palabras que el mismo Jesús pronuncia contra la injusticia (cf. Lc 12,13-21; 16,1-31).

Domingo XXII del Tiempo Ordinario

Hombre religioso es aquél que se siente re-ligado por una relación dialogal con la divinidad. Si el diálogo y la relación humana no puede ser puramente racional ni puramente sentimental, mucho menos el diálogo con Dios. Por eso, yo abogo por una religión del corazón, siendo éste el centro interior de la persona. El corazón, por tanto, visto no sólo como fuente de la afectividad, sino además como sede de la razón, de los sentimientos, de la voluntad, de la conciencia, de la decisión. En la religión del corazón es todo el hombre el que entra en comunicación con Dios: el que habla y escucha, el que es interpelado y responde, el que expresa sus experiencias íntimas y se siente acogido y comprendido. Quizás todavía quede en algunos cristianos huellas de jansenismo, y es necesario acabar con ellas. El cristianismo del futuro está pidiendo una religión del corazón, que llegue a ser el corazón de la religión. En tu experiencia personal, ¿es la religión católica una religión del corazón? ¿Es el culto cristiano un culto del corazón? En la vida litúrgica y sacramental de tu parroquia, ¿se tiene en cuenta esta dimensión integral de la religión, que comprende a toda la persona? Es mucho, muchísimo, lo que se puede hacer todavía para que la religión católica llegue a ser, en cada familia, en cada parroquia, en cada diócesis, en toda la Iglesia, una religión del corazón. La autenticidad debería ser el carnet de identidad de todo hombre, particularmente de todo cristiano. Pero, ¿qué significa ser auténtico? La respuesta depende de la concepción del hombre que se tenga. En una concepción cristiana, "auténtico" no es el que da curso libre a sus impulsos instintivos, sino el que es fiel a sí mismo y a la imagen del hombre integral que la razón y la fe dibujan en su conciencia. "Auténtico" es el hombre que se guía en su actuación por convicciones, el hombre cuya voluntad es movida siempre hacia su fin como persona humana y como hijo de Dios. En definitiva, ser auténtico se entiende como un ideal de ser uno mismo y no otro, no una máscara.
