Exortación Apostólica Amoris Laetitia

Quiero destacar la situación de las familias sumidas en la miseria, castigadas de tantas maneras, donde los límites de la vida se viven de forma lacerante. Si todos tienen dificultades, en un hogar muy pobre se vuelven más duras. Por ejemplo, si una mujer debe criar sola a su hijo, por una separación o por otras causas, y debe trabajar sin la posibilidad de dejarlo con otra persona, el niño crece en un abandono que lo expone a todo tipo de riesgos, y su maduración personal queda comprometida. En las difíciles situaciones que viven las personas más necesitadas, la Iglesia debe tener un especial cuidado para comprender, consolar, integrar, evitando imponerles una serie de normas como si fueran una roca, con lo cual se consigue el efecto de hacer que se sientan juzgadas y abandonadas precisamente por esa Madre que está llamada a acercarles la misericordia de Dios. De ese modo, en lugar de ofrecer la fuerza sanadora de la gracia y la luz del Evangelio, algunos quieren «adoctrinarlo», convertirlo en «piedras muertas para lanzarlas contra los demás».

Fiesta del Bautismo del Señor

En el evangelio el bautismo de Jesús es una epifanía. Eso mismo debe ser el bautismo del cristiano: una epifanía de lo que Dios es y de lo que Dios hace en el hombre. El bautizado, podríamos decir, es un hombre en quien se manifiesta el Dios trinitario, en virtud de la relación personal que mantiene con cada una de las personas divinas. Como hijo del Padre vive una verdadera relación filial, sobretodo en la oración y adoración. Como redimido por el Hijo y sumergido en su misma vida, entabla con él una relación principalmente de seguimiento e imitación. Como templo del Espíritu Santo, vive con la conciencia de una relación sagrada, santificante, vivificadora de su existir cotidiano, modeladora de su vida familiar, profesional y social. El bautizado es al mismo tiempo epifanía de la acción de Dios en el hombre: una acción purificadora, que manifiesta el perdón de Dios; una acción transformante, que pone de relieve el poder de Dios; una acción unificadora de las energías y capacidades del cristiano, que subraya el misterio unitario de Dios; una acción vivificante, que revela, por medio del hombre, la extraordinaria vida de Dios uno y trino... Es importante que la predicación y catequesis tengan muy en cuenta y desarrollen y expliquen estos aspectos espirituales y pastorales del sacramento del bautismo. Así el bautismo no será el sacramento de la “inconsciencia”, sino el sacramento de la epifanía diaria de Dios en la vida, en la fe y en el obrar del bautizado.

Lecturas del próximo domingo

En el Nuevo Testamento el Mesías aparece bajo la figura del esposo. En el texto de las bodas de Caná Jesús es insinuado como esposo en las palabras del maestra sala al recién casado: "Todos sirven primero el vino bueno y cuando ya están bebidos, el inferior. Pero tú has guardado el vino nuevo hasta ahora". En realidad, el "tú" se refiere no tanto al esposo, cuanto a Jesús. Este texto es importante, dado el carácter programático que posee en la estructura del cuarto evangelio. ¿Hay algo característico en esta figura de Jesús esposo? 1) Ciertamente, el poder de cambiar el agua en vino que alude al incipiente gozo y plenitud de gracia del Reino de Dios. El agua del Antiguo Testamento, del Mesías esperado, se convierte en vino del Nuevo Testamento, del Mesías llegado. 2) La abundancia mesiánica. Jesús no convierte en vino unos pocos litros de agua, sino una gran cantidad (240 litros). La sobreabundancia y generosidad de Jesús al inicio de su vida pública caracterizará el resto de su existencia terrena y la vida misma del cristianismo, del que constituirá un elemento estructurante. 3) El Mesías esposo manifiesta su gloria a sus discípulos, que creyeron en Él. La gloria del esposo es precisamente entregarse en plenitud a la esposa y de esta manera iniciar una nueva era de relaciones de Dios con la humanidad: la era cristiana. Las arras son el símbolo de la alianza entre los esposos. Las arras que Jesús-esposo ofrece a la Iglesia-esposa son los carismas, que otorga mediante su Espíritu. Todos y cada uno de los carismas se los entrega Cristo a su Iglesia para que pueda realizar su vocación esponsal. El Espíritu distribuye estos carismas con gran libertad, pero a la vez endereza todos ellos a la utilidad común de toda la Iglesia. Con ellos, la Iglesia puede garantizar su fidelidad a la alianza esponsal con Cristo. A mayor abundancia de carismas en la Iglesia, mayor posibilidad de realizar con perfección su vocación esponsal y su misión de sacramento universal de salvación entre los hombres.

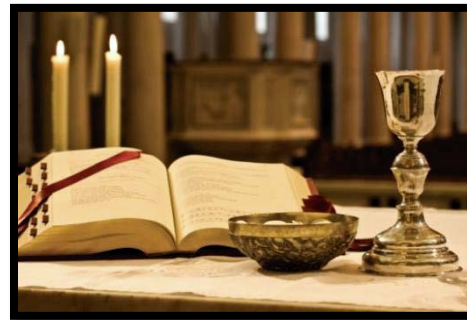

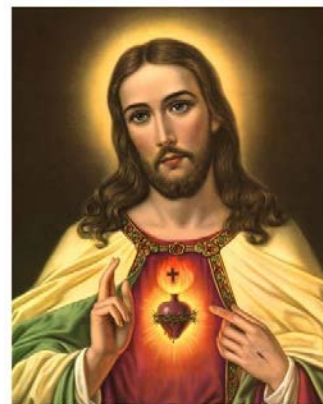
