Algunos desafíos

Las respuestas recibidas a las dos consultas efectuadas durante el camino sinodal, mencionaron las más diversas situaciones que plantean nuevos desafíos. Además de las ya indicadas, muchos se han referido a la función educativa, que se ve dificultada, entre otras causas, porque los padres llegan a su casa cansados y sin ganas de conversar, en muchas familias ya ni siquiera existe el hábito de comer juntos, y crece una gran variedad de ofertas de distracción además de la adicción a la televisión. Esto dificulta la transmisión de la fe de padres a hijos. Otros indicaron que las familias suelen estar enfermas por una enorme ansiedad. Parece haber más preocupación por prevenir problemas futuros que por compartir el presente. Esto, que es una cuestión cultural, se agrava debido a un futuro profesional incierto, a la inseguridad económica, o al temor por el porvenir de los hijos.

Domingo II del tiempo Ordinario

En el Nuevo Testamento el Mesías aparece bajo la figura del esposo. En el texto de las bodas de Caná Jesús es insinuado como esposo en las palabras del maestra sala al recién casado: "Todos sirven primero el vino bueno y cuando ya están bebidos, el inferior. Pero tú has guardado el vino nuevo hasta ahora". En realidad, el "tú" se refiere no tanto al esposo, cuanto a Jesús. Este texto es importante, dado el carácter programático que posee en la estructura del cuarto evangelio. ¿Hay algo característico en esta figura de Jesús esposo? 1) Ciertamente, el poder de cambiar el agua en vino que alude al incipiente gozo y plenitud de gracia del Reino de Dios. El agua del Antiguo Testamento, del Mesías esperado, se convierte en vino del Nuevo Testamento, del Mesías llegado. 2) La abundancia mesiánica. Jesús no convierte en vino unos pocos litros de agua, sino una gran cantidad (240 litros). La sobreabundancia y generosidad de Jesús al inicio de su vida pública caracterizará el resto de su existencia terrena y la vida misma del cristianismo, del que constituirá un elemento estructurante. 3) El Mesías esposo manifiesta su gloria a sus discípulos, que creyeron en Él. La gloria del esposo es precisamente entregarse en plenitud a la esposa y de esta manera iniciar una nueva era de relaciones de Dios con la humanidad: la era cristiana. Las arras son el símbolo de la alianza entre los esposos. Las arras que Jesús-esposo ofrece a la Iglesia-esposa son los carismas, que otorga mediante su Espíritu. Todos y cada uno de los carismas se los entrega Cristo a su Iglesia para que pueda realizar su vocación esponsal. El Espíritu distribuye estos carismas con gran libertad, pero a la vez endereza todos ellos a la utilidad común de toda la Iglesia. Con ellos, la Iglesia puede garantizar su fidelidad a la alianza esponsal con Cristo. A mayor abundancia de carismas en la Iglesia, mayor posibilidad de realizar con perfección su vocación esponsal y su misión de sacramento universal de salvación entre los hombres.

La Biblia es un libro sagrado, que norma nuestra fe y nuestra vida. Por tanto, no puede ser un libro de pasatiempo o de lectura superficial, no comprometida. La Biblia no es un libro que se lee para conciliar el sueño por la noche. La Biblia es Palabra que Dios me dirige personalmente a mí cuando la leo. Y desde el texto la Palabra de Dios me interpela, me lee y me interpreta. Me interpela, buscando una respuesta a lo que me dice mediante la lectura del texto. Me lee, desentrañando los secretos de mi corazón, y suscitando el deseo de cambio. Me interpreta, dando una orientación segura a mi existencia: a mi modo de ser, de pensar, de vivir, de actuar en el mundo, y moviendo mi voluntad a seguirla. En el supermercado de las interpretaciones, no pocas de ellas deshumanizantes, el hombre corre el riesgo de hacerse con una u otra interpretación equivocadas y dañinas. Es un imperativo, por tanto, para nosotros, los cristianos, dejarnos interpretar por la Palabra del Dios vivo, pues Ella es la interpretación más genuina y auténtica del hombre, en cualquier tiempo o lugar en que éste se encuentre. Los domingos, en la liturgia de la Palabra, ¿escucho la Palabra de Dios con la conciencia y el deseo de ser leído e interpretado por Ella? Como sacerdote, ¿me dejo interpretar por la Palabra de Dios antes de explicarla e interpretarla para la comunidad?

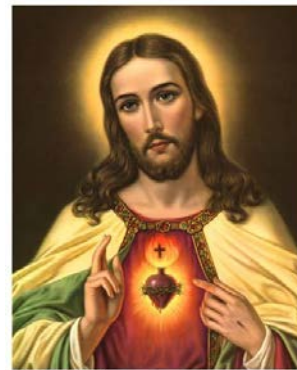
