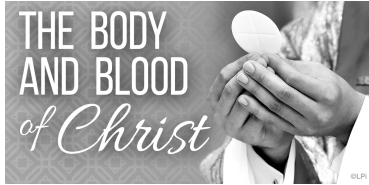

50 YEARS LATER**
