Blasphemy of the Holy Spirit Time to take your medicine...The sin of Blasphemy of the Holy Spirit is prominent in Mark 3:20-25. It is a sin that has caused much fear among Christians over the years, as our Lord Himself states that it is unforgivable. Who in their right mind would wish to commit a sin that was unforgivable? Therefore, it is important to look deeper into the event that precipitated this statement. The scribes were not making a casual error, they were intentionally, out of pride, choosing to reject the promised Messiah. St. Jose Maria-Escrivera likens this to the person who is fatally ill rejecting the doctor and medicine who can effect a complete life saving cure. We, unlike the Scribes and Pharisees, may not reject the Doctor outright, but we may find ourselves rejecting the medicine. When we reject the Sacraments, or fail to participate in them, are we not rejecting Christ who gave them to us.

God is capable of forgiving all sins, but His forgiveness must be requested. Here is the benefit of the Sacrament of Confession/Reconciliation. We come in humility to request God's remedy for our sins. Our Lord gave the Apostles and their successors the authority to forgive sins. The doctors and the medicine are ready at hand. Do we purse our lips and refuse to receive, refuse to even ask, for the healing of our Lord?

We are encouraged to avail ourselves of this sacrament yearly at least. Additionally we need to make a good confession any time we become aware of mortal sin in our lives. Mortal sins are those grave sins which a person commits, with full knowledge and deliberate consent. If we commit sin, and refuse to confess, are we not rejecting the saving effect of that medicine given us by the Lord through His Church? We would be far better off to comply with the closing sentence of today's Gospel, "For whoever does the will of God is my brother and sister and mother." Mark 3:35 Let us then obey in humility the will of God, and never need to worry about committing the sin of blasphemy of the Holy Spirit.
