A message from Fr. Vieira.....

Be Careful What You Say or Do, Little Eyes are Watching You....

Whoever causes one of these little ones who believe in me to sin, it would be better for him if a great millstone were hung round his neck and he were thrown into the sea. Mark 9:42

Such harsh words our Lord speaks in this Gospel. We often wish to attribute a certain softness to Jesus, but, in reality, He pulled no punches. The sin of causing scandal is very grave because it can cause serious damage to the souls of those exposed to it. He saw it as so serious that He tells us that such a one would be better taken out and drowned. Harsh words indeed. But why? The damage and potential condemnation of another's soul is to be avoided at all cost. Encouraging someone to sin through our words or actions places us in the same league with the serpent in the Garden of Eden.

This brings us to the definition of who is a “little one”. The term little one could be limited to children, but as the Apostle Paul points out, even adults can be immature in the faith. Our words, thoughts and actions can influence others to reject the Faith, or become twisted in their understanding of the Faith. Either way, this can then be passed on to others like a contagion swiftly spreading to bring spiritual death. Let us prayerfully commit each day to God, that we might be the cause for healing and eternal life to those around us.
