

## A message from Fr. Vieira.....

All gave some, some gave all!

The Lord was watching next to the Temple treasury, and as He watched, there were those who came and dropped large sums of money into the offering. They are often envisioned as approaching with great swagger and making a scene when making their offering. The world must know of their gift to the Temple. Then something caught Our Lord's attention. A woman quietly shuffles forward toward the offering box. Her clothes indicate she is a widow, from within the folds of her clothing she produces two small coins, about a half-penny each, and furtively drops them in the offering. Probably seeing herself as quite forgotten and forgettable, she has been remembered for nearly two thousand years, and will continue to be remembered until the end of time. Was it the huge weight of the money she donated? No, it was the heart of love with which it was given. Her love for God, and her trust in His ability to provide enabled her to give all she had to God.

The widow of Zarephath to whom Elijah was sent in our Old Testament reading was in a similar position. She was asked by God, through Elijah, to give all that she had for the care of another. In a time of intense famine she had only enough flour for one last meager meal before starving. She was now asked to give that to another, trusting in the providence of God, Who in return gave her and her son food throughout the famine. Are we able to give so trustingly of all we have?
