## A message from Fr. Vieira.....

### Words of Hope for the Future

One of the greatest difficulties anyone can face is a loss of hope. Hope is one of the three Theological Virtues as named by St. Thomas Aquinas. Despair is considered a sin against Hope. The problems we may face in this life however, can lead us to begin to lose hope. Can a Gospel passage that speaks of the sun and moon darkened and stars falling from Heaven bring us hope? Absolutely!

We are reminded that we are to live in the “sure and certain hope of the resurrection”. What a sad world it would be if our entire existence were to be bound to the existence of this world. The disciples started this entire conversation with an admiration of the Temple. It was beautiful, yet the Lord responded by foretelling its destruction about 37 years in the future. Such a prophecy must have passed a thrill of fear through the disciples even as it does to us today. Yet in the midst of all this we are admonished to have hope. Hope in the knowledge that God is in control of all things.

The issues of this present age are real and present. They are even anticipated for our purification and to increase our trust in the knowledge that God is present in the disasters of our lives as well as the joys and successes. Let us give thanks that in the midst of all things God has given us eternal hope in His promise, “I will never leave you or forsake you.” (Heb. 13:5b)
