The King is coming!!

This Sunday is the first Sunday of Advent, the theme is Hope, yet the Gospel lesson is one concerning the end of the world. At first glance it might seem counterintuitive to express hope when the Gospel reading speaks of events that will cause the people to be in dismay. It is not hard to imagine such events even in our day. One has only to look at the photos of the damage from the earthquake in Alaska this past week, or the horrific fires in California to realize that there is much to be worried about.

Yet we are admonished to have hope. We have hope because there are two major factors in our favor. We are children of God, and trust that He has our best interests in mind, no matter what is happening in the world around us.
