A message from Fr. Vieira.....

Where do you place your treasure?

In the Gospel of Luke, Jesus has a member of the crowd ask Him to “...tell my brother to share the inheritance with me.” One could safely assume that this was not someone who was destitute and homeless as Jesus’ response is to admonish him and those gathered to guard against greed. Indeed, it is said that the “love of money is the root of all evil”. This then is the point of the parable that follows. A man is blessed with a super-abundant harvest; however, instead of giving thanks to God, and giving a proper portion of his abundance in thanksgiving, he chose to hoard his harvest and sought to live off the results of his harvest for a lengthy time. What he did not count on was a sudden summons to the judgement of the Father.

Modern society is infatuated with what is new and what is trendy. It is not uncommon to encounter the theme of those who rush through life pursuing money and what money can buy, only to discover that their lives are at an end and there is little to nothing that can be taken with them. I have known married couples who do not want to have children because it will get in the way of their ability to make money and have all the toys. Sadly, the future generations will be the worse for their decisions. Far better to invest ourselves in the lives of our children, family, and friends, and in worship of God. In so doing we have contributed to generations a gift far more valuable than any amount of money.
