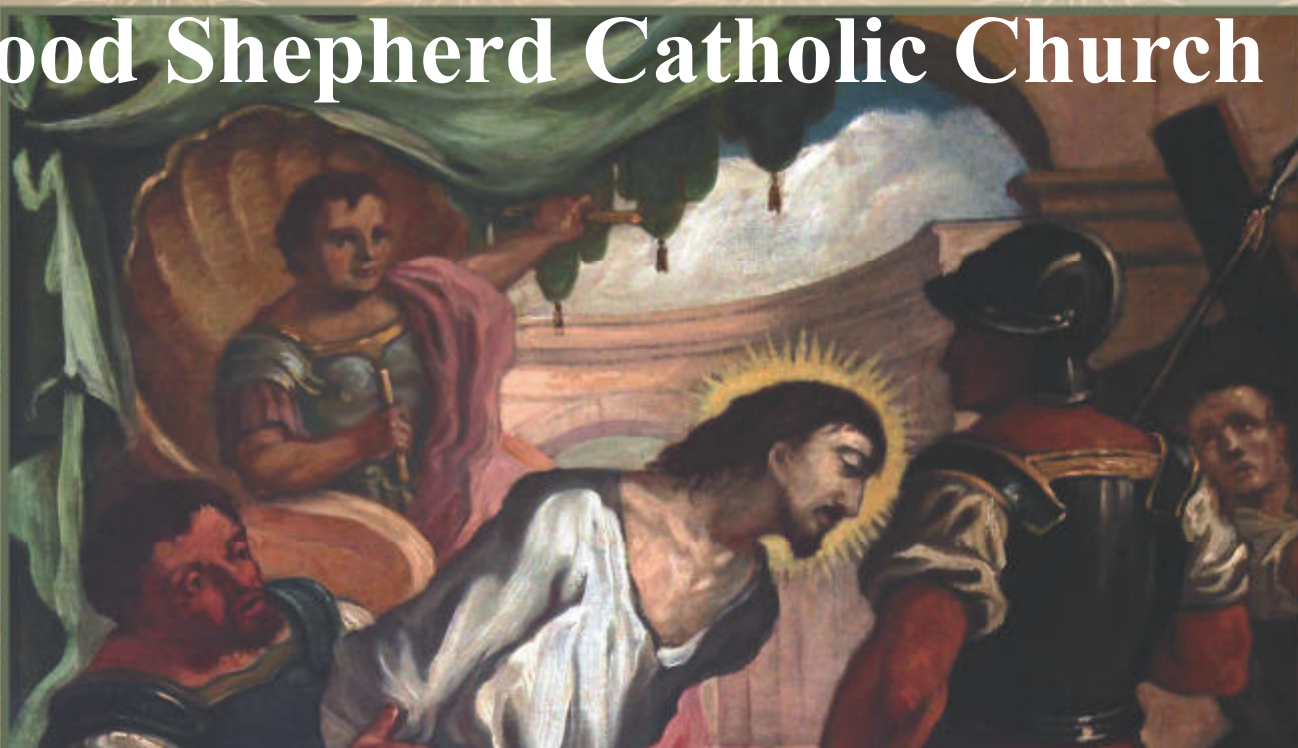

FOOD PANTRY COORDINATOR

NAC Food Pantry is seeking an outgoing, well-organized coordinator. The coordinator will be responsible for organizing volunteers to help at the pantry, maintaining relationships with community organizations and advancing the pantry’s mission of ensuring food security for local families in need. This is a volunteer position with a minimum commitment of 15+ hours/week. This may increase depending on the season.

Requirements:

- **Inventory Management**-ordering, receiving and sorting food, both from the Food Bank as well as donations. Organizing the storage and shopping area at the Pantry.
- **Relationship Building**-maintaining partnerships with Dollar Tree, Shaw’s and the Northbridge High School Community Garden.
- **Fundraising**-organizing fundraisers and grants for the Food Pantry.
- **Reporting**-preparing monthly status reports for the Food Bank and NAC at monthly meetings.
- **Volunteer Management**-using Word and Excel to coordinate volunteer schedules. Train volunteers on food distribution.
- **Required certificates** (can be obtained after start date) - Servsafe, Orientation class at the Food Bank.

We will have handicrafts, bake table, cookie walk, rosary table, knitting and crocheting table, handmade jewelry table, stained glass, 50/50 raffle, super raffle, and a general raffle. 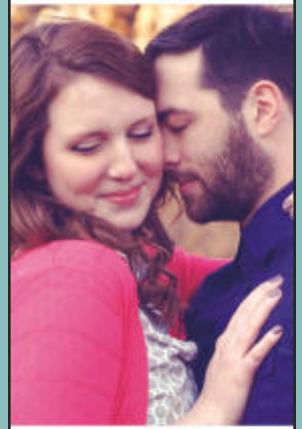
