Saturday from 4:00pm to 4:45pm. You may phone one of the
priests for a private confession at a mutually agreeable time.

BAPTISM:

Celebrated on the 2nd Sunday of each month at 1:30pm. Parents
should phone the parish office to make arrangements for
Baptism Instructions as well as the Baptism date.

MATRIMONY:

Arrangements are made by the bride and groom with one of the
priests at least six months before the proposed date of the
wedding to allow sufficient time to participate in the Marriage
Preparation Program and gather necessary documents.
Arrangements should be made with the Church prior to
reserving the reception hall to avoid any scheduling conflict.

COMMUNION TO THE HOMEBOUND:

We would like to help our parishioners who cannot join the
Sunday Assembly due to illness, age or physical impairment.
Arrangements can be made to have Holy Communion brought
to the homebound by Eucharistic Ministers from our Sunday
celebrations. Mass is televised every Sunday at 9:00am and
daily at 8:30am on cable channel 10 (WLNY-TV) and daily at
8:00am and 12 noon on cable channel 68 (EWTN).

Miraculous Medal Novena: Every Monday following the
8:00am Mass.

Novena to St. Anthony: Thirteen Tuesdays (before June 13th)
following the 8:00am Mass.

Rosary every morning at 7:30am before the 8:00am Mass.

Holy Hour: First Saturday of each month 9:30am-10:30am.

The church is open during the week for personal prayer and
meditation during daylight hours.

Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament every Wednesday from
8:30am until 4:00pm in church with Rosary at 2:30pm and
Divine Mercy Chaplet at 3:00pm.

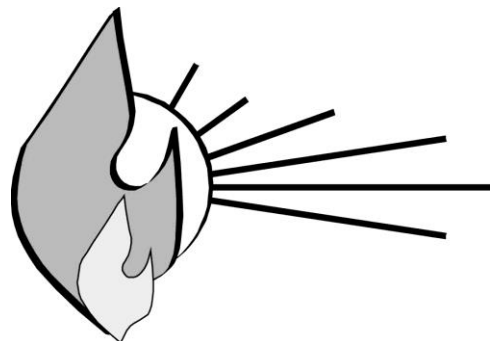
LONGEST MARRIED COUPLE SEARCH

SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME



“The grace of God has appeared, saving all, and training us to reject godless ways and worldly desires and to live temperately, justly and devoutly in this age, and to await the blessed hope, the appearance of the glory of our great God and of our savior Jesus Christ, who gave Himself for us to deliver us from all lawlessness and to cleanse for Himself a people of His own, eager to do what is good.”

How fortunate for Titus to receive an encouraging letter from Saint Paul. As we bring the Christmas season to a close as Jesus’ baptism takes place, we too are encouraged to make the instruction our own. Yes, Jesus has come and still lives among us. We are challenged each day to abandon godless ways and focus on keeping our eyes on Jesus.

If life was difficult for Paul’s friends, how much more challenging it is for us, surrounded by the internet, consumer attractions and all sorts of distractions drawing us in a different direction. How clear are Paul’s words asking us to live temperately, when so many have nothing, to live justly, in a society which wishes to get ahead and put others down, and devoutly, when many look down on people with religious devotion, customs and traditions.

Paul knew his society and we are so aware of ours. Why not take the virtues Paul recommends and meditate on one each day. May this help us to become eager to do what is good.

Isaiah tells of the Lord’s Servant, who will be inconspicuous, but will not rest until justice is established. The Lord then tells his servant that he was formed to be “a light for the nations.”

Second Reading: Acts 10:34-38

Peter speaks to a group of pagans for the first time. He explains to them that any person who follows God’s will is acceptable to God, regardless of nationality.

Gospel: Luke 3:15-16, 21-22

John the Baptist had claimed one would come far more powerful than himself, one who would baptize with the Holy Spirit rather than water. When Jesus came to John and was baptized, the Spirit descended on him and a voice said, “You are my beloved Son. On you my favor rests.”
