NEW CHANGES FOR LECTORS and DEACONS

Lectors and/or Deacons, when proclaiming the Word of God (Epistles) it is done at the Ambo, all other prayers, i.e., Prayer of the Faithful, Rosary, Announcements, etc., will be read from the Choir-side Podium. This is in keeping with the General Instructions of the Roman Missal implementing Canon Law taken from Chapter II: Arrangement of the Sanctuary for the Sacred Synaxis (Eucharistic Assembly), The Ambo, #309: *“From the Ambo only the readings, the responsorial Psalm, and the Easter Proclamation (Exsultet) are to be proclaimed; it may be used also for giving the homily and for announcing the intentions of the Prayer of the Faithful. The dignity of the ambo requires that only one minister of the word should go up.”* These changes are to take effect immediately.
