Onto Business...

Religion: We begin our next chapter on worshipping God by praying, through service but especially through the Eucharist. We will have a test on this chapter next week.

Math: Our math goals for this year are going to take off as we begin multiplication. I will begin work on multiplication facts here at school. We will have worksheets that work on one digit at a time (so all 2's 3's and so on... 2x2 2x3 2x4). Our goal for our test is 100 problems in 5 minutes earning an 85% or better. We will also study the concepts: estimation, and multiplying with regrouping

Science: We continue our study of invertebrates this week as we learn about identifying characteristics of arachnids and other arthropods. We also classify animals as to what they eat: Herbivores, Carnivores or Omnivores.
