There is a series of reflections for the 40 days of Lent that I recently came across that help us attempt to appreciate the suffering that Mary endured. May our Blessed Mother Mary be with us this Lent and help us to experience a greater depth of God's love.

Stations of the Cross

Another way that we can experience God's love for us is by attending the Stations of the Cross. Almost every Catholic church around the world has the Stations. These are a constant reminder of the suffering our Lord endured in order to prove His love for us.
