# From the Pastor's Desk

The Lord tells us: I am the light of the world; he who follows me will not walk in darkness, but will have the light of life.

In these few words he gives a command and makes a promise. Let us do what he commands so that we may not blush to covet what he promises and to hear him say on the day of judgement: "I laid down certain conditions for obtaining my promises. Have you fulfilled them?" If you say: "What did you command, Lord our God?" he will tell you: "I commanded you to follow me. You asked for advice on how to enter into life. What life, if not the life about which it is written: With you is the fountain of life?"

Let us do now what he commands. Let us follow in the footsteps of the Lord. Let us throw off the chains that prevent us from following him. Who can throw off these shackles without the aid of the one addressed in these words: You have broken my chains? Another psalm says of him: The Lord frees those in chains, the Lord raises up the downcast.

Those who have been freed and raised up follow the light. The light they follow speaks to them: I am the light of the world; he who follows me will not walk in darkness. The Lord gives light to the blind. Brethren, that light shines on us now, for we have had our eyes anointed with the eye-salve of faith. His saliva was mixed with earth to anoint the man born blind. We are of Adam's stock, blind from our birth; we need him to give us light. He mixed saliva with earth, and so it was prophesied: Truth has sprung up from the earth. He

himself has said: I am the way, the truth and the life. We shall be in possession of the truth when we see face to face. This is his promise to us. Who would dare to hope for something that God in his goodness did not choose to promise or bestow?

We shall see face to face. The Apostle says: Now I know in part, now obscurely through a mirror, but then face to face. John the Apostle says in one of his letters: Dearly beloved, we are now children of God, and it has not yet been revealed what we shall be. We know that when he is revealed we shall be like him, for we shall see him as he is. This is a great promise.

If you love me, follow me. "I do love you", you protest, "but how do I follow you?" If the Lord your God said to you: "I am the truth and the life", in your desire for truth, in your love for life, you would certainly ask him to show you the way to reach them. You would say to yourself: "Truth is a great reality, life is a great reality; if only it were possible for my soul to find them!"

This excerpt from St. Augustine's treatise on the Gospel of John (Tract. 34, 8-9; CCL 36, 315-316) appears in the Roman Office of Readings for this Sunday, the Fourth Sunday of Lent.

St. Augustine, 4th century convert, bishop, doctor of the Church, and intellectual supergiant, continues to have tremendous influence on the life and mind of the Church today. His books and homilies are great spiritual and philosophical reading, especially as he wrote in a cultural situation (the deterioration of the Roman Empire) somewhat similar to our own times. St. Augustine, pray for us!

# Stewardship



As we are called to serve our brothers and sisters throughout our larger community and the world, the Catholic Services Appeal Foundation (CSAF) provides a means to help us effectively meet those in need. Through CSAF's many valuable ministries, we are able to expand our reach beyond our parish boundaries while, also, providing benefits to those close by – through Youth and Young Adult Ministry, Campus Ministry, Hospital Chaplains, Prison Ministry, Evangelization and Catechesis, support for our seminarians in formation, and assistance for those most in need right in our neighborhood. Many of these ministries do not receive additional funding other than from the CSAF.

As of March 22nd, St. Charles Borromeo parishioners have generously pledged or given \$79,381 to the Catholic Services Appeal Foundation (CSAF). With two weekends remaining, this amount already exceeds our goal by 28% - THANK YOU! Monies received to date totaled \$59,313; almost 96% of the goal has already been received. However, the number of donors stands only at 169, which is down 78 from the 247 donors in 2018. If you have not sent in your 2019 pledge form, please

Help us make our goal of exceeding the number of donors from a year ago – remember that every donation from the heart is of untold value! Mats for the Homeless. Are you looking for a worthy service project before Lent is over? Mats for the Homeless is having a Saturday session on April 13 from 2:30-4:30 pm in the St. John Education Center. This is a great opportunity for men, women, and families to help flatten plastic bags, sort them, make "plarn" (plastic yarn), and learn how to make mats out of plastic bags for those less fortunate. Parts of this EASY project can be done at home, so come find out how you can help and get involved. Call Gail with questions.

Mats for the Homeless now has a large green receptacle in the Atrium for collecting plastic bags. We need plastic shopping bags, the kind with handles that you get at grocery, department, clothing stores, and the like. The bags must be CLEAN and have no holes. All sizes and colors are welcome. Bags that do not work include produce bags (too thin), carryout food bags and ziplock bags (too thick), bread and newspaper bags (too narrow). Keep bags you use and donate the ones you normally recycle or throw away. Thanks for your on-going donations!





A New Program for Family Life! Developed by Joanne and Alan Foley with the help of the Office of Marriage, Family and Life of the Archdiocese of St. Paul and Minneapolis, EARLY CATHOLIC FAMILY LIFE is an exciting program that emphasizes the importance of putting faith at the center of family life. It is an excellent way to build community among parents with young children within parish life and to assist them to develop the spirituality their children were given at baptism. ECFL is a parent-child program aimed at an underserved but essential part of all parishes: parents with children 0-5 years old. ECFL is an eight session 2-hour class. Classes can be offered weekly, monthly, on week days, weekends or during evening hours. Each class includes early childhood, faith-based and fun activities for families.

ECFL consists of a parent-child interaction component, a parent discussion time and a children's time.

ECFL gives parents an opportunity to learn more about their Catholic faith, discuss faith with other adults, and build supportive relationships within the parish.

In order to make this program successful, we need volunteers for the sessions which will begin next year. Training will take place in late Spring or Summer depending on the need and amount of volunteers. We will need people to work with children as well as adults.
